5	Under existing law, an application for an
6	absentee ballot may only be delivered to the absentee
7	election manager by the applicant. Also under existing
8	law, an absentee ballot may only be delivered to the
9	absentee election manager by the voter of the absentee
10	ballot.
11	This bill would allow a disabled voter to
12	designate an individual to deliver the voter's
13	application for an absentee ballot to the absentee
14	election manager.

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27	Relating to absentee voting; to amend Sections 17-11-4
28	and 17-11-9, Code of Alabama 1975, to allow a disabled voter



29 to designate an individual to deliver the voter's application 30 for an absentee ballot to the absentee election manager; to 31 allow a disabled voter to designate an individual to deliver 32 the voter's absentee ballot to the absentee election manager; 33 and to make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the 34 existing code language to current style. 35 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 36 Section 1. Sections 17-11-4 and 17-11-9, Code of 37 Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows: "\$17-11-4 38 39 (a) The application required in Section 17-11-3 shall be filed with the person individual designated to serve as the 40 absentee election manager. The application shall be in a form 41 42 prescribed and designed by the Secretary of State and shall be 43 used throughout the state. Notwithstanding the foregoing, handwritten applications can may also be accepted at any time 44 prior to the five-day deadline to receive absentee ballot 45 46 applications as provided in Section 17-11-3. 47 (b) The application shall contain sufficient

information to identify the applicant and shall include the applicant's name, residence address, or such other information necessary to verify that the applicant is a registered voter. The application shall also list all felonies of moral turpitude, as provided in Section 17-3-30.1.

53 (c) Any applicant may receive assistance in filling out 54 the application as he or she desires, but each application 55 shall be manually signed by the applicant and, if he or she 56 signs by mark, the name of the witness to his or her signature



57 shall be signed thereon on the application.

58 (d) The application may be handed by the applicant to 59 the absentee election manager or forwarded sent to him or her 60 the absentee election manager by United States mail or by commercial carrier, as determined by rule by the Secretary of 61 62 State. An application for a voter who requires emergency 63 treatment by a licensed physician within five days before an 64 election pursuant to Section 17-11-3 may be forwarded hand delivered to the absentee election manager by the applicant or 65 his or her designee or sent by United States mail or 66 67 commercial carrier. An application for a disabled voter may be hand delivered by the applicant or his or her designee to the 68 69 absentee election manager or sent by the applicant or his or her designee to the absentee election manager by United States 70 71 mail or by commercial carrier.

(e) Application forms that are printed and made available to any applicant by the absentee election manager shall have printed thereon on the application all penalties provided for any violation of this chapter. The Secretary of State shall provide applications for absentee voting to military and overseas voters in accordance with Section 17-4-35."

80 <u>(a) (1)</u> Each prospective absentee voter who meets the 81 requirements of this chapter shall be furnished with the 82 absentee ballot herein provided for, together with two 83 envelopes for returning his or her marked ballot and 84 instructions for completing and returning the absentee ballot



85 as well as instructions for correcting mistakes in completing 86 ballots or obtaining a replacement ballot.

87 (2) One envelope shall be a plain envelope in which the 88 ballot shall be sealed by the voter after he or she has marked 89 it.

90 <u>(3)</u> The second envelope shall have the voter's 91 affidavit printed on the back and shall be large enough to 92 seal the plain ballot envelope inside. The second envelope 93 shall also be a return mail envelope. <u>Such The</u> return mail 94 envelope shall be addressed on the front to the absentee 95 election manager and shall be endorsed on the left-hand upper 96 corner thereof as follows:

97 "Absent Voter's Ballot. State, County, Municipal, 98 General, Primary, or Special Election (as the case may be) to 99 be held on the \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_, 2\_\_\_ From \_\_\_\_\_ (name of 100 voter), precinct or districts \_\_\_\_\_, County of \_\_\_\_\_, 101 Alabama."

102 (b) After marking the ballot and subscribing the oath herein required, the voter shall seal his or her ballot in the 103 104 plain envelope, place that plain envelope inside the affidavit 105 envelope, complete the affidavit, have a notary public (or other officer authorized to acknowledge oaths) or two 106 107 witnesses individuals witness his or her signature to the 108 affidavit, and forward send it by United States mail or by 109 commercial carrier to the absentee election manager or hand it to him or her in persondeliver the sealed envelope to the 110 absentee election manager. A disabled voter or his or her 111 112 designee may hand deliver the sealed envelope to the absentee



## 113 election manager or send it by United States mail or by

114 commercial carrier.

115 (c) (1) Notwithstanding the other provisions of this 116 section, the absentee election manager shall determine whether 117 an applicant for an absentee ballot is obligated to produce 118 identification in accordance with Sections 17-9-30 and 17-10-1 119 or reidentify in accordance with Chapter 4. For absentee 120 applicants required to produce identification, a third 121 envelope of different color and sufficient size to enclose the first and second envelopes shall be provided to the applicant 122 123 along with instructions for including a proper form of identification in accordance with Sections 17-9-30 and 124 125 17 - 10 - 1.

126 (2) For absentee applicants required to reidentify 127 because they do not appear in the voting place for which they 128 seek to vote but do appear in another voting place within the 129 state voter registration list, the absentee election manager 130 shall provide to the voter a third envelope of different color 131 and sufficient size to enclose the first and second envelopes 132 along with a voter reidentification form, a provisional voter 133 affirmation, and instructions in accordance with Section 134 17-10-2. Such-The ballot shall be treated as a provisional 135 ballot and the term "Provisional" shall be marked on the 136 second or affidavit envelope prior to transmitting the ballot 137 to the voter.

138 <u>(3)</u> Applicants for an absentee ballot who do not appear 139 on the state voter registration list shall not be entitled to 140 an absentee ballot."



141 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first 142 day of the third month following its passage and approval by 143 the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
