8 SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, the state imposes an ad valorem tax at a rate established by statute on the assessed value of taxable property, which value varies as a percentage of actual value depending upon the particular property. In addition, counties, municipalities, and certain other local taxing authorities impose various additional sales and use taxes and ad valorem taxes. Certain types of property and certain entities are exempt from state, county, or local ad valorem taxes.

To exempt the Alabama Association of Volunteer Fire Departments, county volunteer fire associations, the Alabama Association of Rescue Squads, Incorporated, all volunteer rescue squads that are members of the Alabama Association of Rescue Squads, all county volunteer rescue associations, all local fire districts that are not under the auspices of their county commission from any state, county, and local sales and use taxes and ad valorem taxes; provided no tax which has proceeds dedicated to K-12 public education may be exempted.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The Alabama Association of Volunteer Fire Departments, county volunteer fire associations, the Alabama Association of Rescue Squads, Incorporated, all volunteer rescue squads that are members of the Alabama Association of Rescue Squads, all county volunteer rescue associations, and all local fire districts that are not under the auspices of their county commission are exempt from any state, county, and local sales and use taxes and ad valorem taxes; provided no tax which has proceeds dedicated to K-12 public education may be exempted.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
