 - (b) The Dementia Services Coordinator shall promote public and professional awareness of and education related to dementia by promoting access to relevant services and programs and fulfilling all of the following duties:
 - (1) Evaluating:

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- a. The coordination of dementia services withinAlabama, including the identification of duplicate services;
- 38 b. Dementia-related data collected by relevant state 39 agencies concerning the impact of dementia in Alabama; and
- 40 c. Grant opportunities to expand the scope of services 41 for individuals living with dementia and their caregivers.
- 42 (2) Coordinating information and resources affecting
 43 Alabamians living with dementia and their caregivers,
 44 including, but not limited to:
 - a. Using dementia-related data to coordinate ways to improve public health outcomes and the delivery of services to individuals with Alzheimer's disease or related dementia;
 - b. Establishing and maintaining relationships with other agencies, providers, and organizations within the state to meet the needs of affected populations and prevent the duplication of services;
 - c. Supporting the provision of dementia-specific staff training across all relevant state agencies, including, but not limited to, law enforcement, the Department of Senior Services, and the Department of Public Health; and
 - d. Recommending strategies to improve coordination of

- 59 (3) Streamlining all applicable state government 60 services to increase efficiency and improve the quality of 61 care in residential, home, and community-based settings.

- (5) Overseeing the implementation and revision of the State Plan for Alzheimer's Disease and Other Related Dementias in Alabama.
