2 3 4 SYNOPSIS: 5 This bill would provide that the 9/11 6 Remembrance Freedom Flag may be displayed on any 7 publicly owned property or premises. 8 This bill would also provide that a person who 9 displays an unapproved flag on publicly owned property commits a misdemeanor. 10 11 Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect 12 would be to require a new or increased expenditure of 13 14 local funds from becoming effective with regard to a 15 local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of 16 17 specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected

18 entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for 19 the purpose.

21 The purpose or effect of this bill would be to 22 require a new or increased expenditure of local funds 23 within the meaning of the section. However, the bill 24 does not require approval of a local governmental 25 entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective 26 because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the section. 27

34	Relating to flags; to provide that the Freedom Flag may
35	be displayed on any publicly owned property or premises; to
36	provide that a person who displays an unapproved flag on
37	publicly owned property commits a misdemeanor; and in
38	connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the
39	requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds
40	within the meaning of Section 111.05 of the Constitution of
41	Alabama of 2022.
42	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
43	Section 1. The Freedom Flag, created as a national
44	symbol of remembrance of the victims of the terrorist attacks
45	of September 11, 2001, is authorized to be displayed on any
46	publicly owned property or premises.
47	Section 2. (a) It shall be unlawful for any individual
48	to place, hoist, raise, or display any flag, standard, colors,
49	or ensign upon any publicly owned property or premises other
50	than any of the following:
51	(1) The national flag of the United States.
52	(2) The official flag of any nation or state that
53	preceded the United States or the State of Alabama in
54	controlling any territory currently constituting the State of
55	Alabama.
56	(3) The official flag of any state, territory, or



57 district of the United States. 58 (4) The official flag of any municipality in this 59 state. 60 (5) The official flag of the Boy Scouts of America. (6) The official flag of the Girl Scouts of the United 61 62 States of America. 63 (7) The official flag of the American Red Cross. 64 (8) The American Ex-Prisoner of War flag. 65 (9) The National League of Families POW/MIA flag. (10) The Freedom Flag. 66 67 (11) Any other flag, standard, colors, or ensign approved by the entity in control of the property. 68 69 (b) All roads, streets, highways, stadiums, arenas, and 70 athletic facilities are exempt from the restrictions of 71 subsection (a). (c) A violation of subsection (a) is a Class C 72 73 misdemeanor. 74 Section 3. Although this bill would have as its purpose 75 or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of 76 local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements 77 and application under Section 111.05 of the Constitution of 78 Alabama of 2022, because the bill defines a new crime or 79 amends the definition of an existing crime. 80 Section 4. This act shall become effective on October 81 1, 2024.
