12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
13	Section 1. Section 45-2-244.183 of the Code of
14	Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:
15	"§45-2-244.183.
16	"(a) The privilege license tax levied hereunder,
17	except where otherwise provided, shall be due and payable in
18	monthly installments on or before the twentieth day of the
19	month next succeeding the month in which the privilege license
20	tax accrues. On or before such twentieth day, every person on
21	whom the amounts levied hereunder are imposed shall render to
22	the county, on a form or forms prescribed by the county
23	commission or State Department of Revenue, a true and correct
24	statement showing the gross proceeds of his or her business
25	for the next preceding month, the amount of gross proceeds

which are not subject to the privilege license tax, or are not 1 2 to be used as a measurement of the amounts due by such person 3 and the nature thereof, together with such other information as the county commission may require, and at the time of 4 5 making such monthly report such person shall compute the privilege license taxes due and shall pay the Baldwin County 6 Commission the amounts shown to be due. All taxes of the 7 8 county shall be deposited into the general fund of the county treasury to be distributed as follows: 9

10 "(1) Seventy-five percent shall be distributed to 11 the county general fund to be expended, as approved by the Baldwin County Commission, for general purposes; however, and 12 13 per fiscal year from the foregoing distribution, the Baldwin 14 County Commission shall appropriate one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) into a separate county fund to be used for 15 16 the operation of the Baldwin County Legislative Office, established by Section 45-2-190, including, but not limited 17 18 to, office equipment, communication equipment, salary 19 supplements for personnel of the legislative delegation office, training, and official public travel for members of 20 21 the Baldwin County Legislative Delegation and personnel of the 22 legislative delegation office and other expenses deemed 23 appropriate only by written direction provided the Baldwin 24 County Commission by the members of the Baldwin County 25 Legislative Delegation. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the

expenses for official travel shall not exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000) per member per year and shall be subject to periodic audits by the Examiners of Public Accounts.

"(2) Twenty-five percent shall be distributed into a 4 5 separate county fund to be expended, as approved by the Baldwin County Commission in a resolution spread upon its 6 minutes, in equal portions for the Fort Morgan State Historic 7 8 Site and for Historic Blakeley Authority. The portion distributed for the Fort Morgan State Historic Site shall be 9 10 expended solely for capital outlay. Of the portion distributed 11 to the Historic Blakeley Authority, for the fiscal year ending 12 September 30, 2010 2013, and the next three two fiscal years 13 thereafter, one-half shall be expended for capital outlay and 14 the remaining one-half the funds may be expended 50 percent 15 for either capital outlay or for and 50 percent for 16 operations. For the next two fiscal years thereafter, 17 three-fourths shall be expended for capital outlay and the 18 remaining one-fourth may be expended for either capital outlay 19 or for operations. Thereafter, the entire portion distributed to the Historic Blakeley Authority shall be expended for 20 21 capital outlay. Notwithstanding the foregoing earmarking of 22 expenditures for the Historic Blakeley Authority for capital 23 outlay, in any fiscal year that the authority adds to and supplements its lease tax revenue with contributions of 24 capital expansion funds or other equivalent capital 25

contributions of real or personal property from other sources, 1 an amount of funds from this act earmarked for capital outlay 2 3 equal to 50 percent of the additional contributions for capital outlay or equivalent capital contributions may be 4 5 expended for operations in lieu of expending for capital outlay. Each entity receiving funds shall submit to the county 6 commission a master plan for capital outlay. The Baldwin 7 8 County Commission shall authorize the respective disbursements 9 divided equally between the two entities upon the annual 10 submission of a budget of expenditures based upon the master 11 plan. Disbursements shall be made quarterly to the entities 12 receiving funds. Any deviation from the master plan for 13 capital outlay shall be subject to the approval of the county 14 commission and such approval shall neither be unreasonably 15 delayed nor unreasonably withheld.

16 "(3) Privilege or license taxes collected and 17 expended under authority of this subpart shall be audited by 18 the Examiners of Public Accounts.

"(b) If any person subject hereto should fail to render any report, return, statement, or form required hereby or should willfully make false statement of facts in the report, return, statement, or form required hereunder, he or she shall upon conviction be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500) for each violation of this section."

1	Section 2. This act shall become effective
2	immediately following its passage and approval by the
3	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
