SB57
ENROLLED, An Act,
To amend Sections 23-1-50.1 and 41-17A-6 of the Code
of Alabama 1975; to allow the Department of Transportation
Office of Fleet Management to review state department and
agency green fleets plans, develop a statewide fleet
management program and to repeal Chapter 17, Title 41 of the
Code of Alabama 1975, regarding the purchase, lease,
operation, and maintenance of state motor vehicles.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
Section 1. Sections 23-1-50.1 and 41-17A-6 of the
Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
"§23-1-50.1.
"(a) It is the intent of the Legislature to give the
State Department of Transportation authority to accumulate
depreciation, equipment replacement allowances, and salvage
value on road machinery and equipment sufficient to upgrade,
replace, or make extraordinary repairs to the road machinery
and equipment of the State Department of Transportation, as
determined by a road machinery and equipment management
program to be developed by the department.

"(b) Unless the context clearly indicates otherwise,
 the following words and phrases will have the following meanings:

3 "(1) STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION DIVISIONS.
4 Those divisions of the Department of Transportation
5 responsible for road construction and maintenance over a
6 specified geographic area of the state.

7 "(2) DEPRECIATION. That process of allocating the
8 original cost per fixed asset over the productive life of the
9 asset using some generally accepted method of depreciation.

10 "(3) EQUIPMENT MANAGEMENT SURPLUS RESERVE ACCOUNT. A 11 special revolving account or fund to be established in the 12 Public Road and Bridge Fund of the State Department of 13 Transportation to accumulate depreciation, equipment 14 replacement allowances, and salvage value to be used to 15 upgrade, replace, or make extraordinary repairs to road 16 machinery and equipment.

17 "(4) EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT ALLOWANCE. An amount, 18 when added to the depreciation and salvage value of a unit of 19 road machinery and equipment and accumulated in a special 20 account, that will provide the funds to upgrade, replace, or 21 make extraordinary repairs to that unit of road machinery and 22 equipment.

"(5) EXTRAORDINARY REPAIRS. Repairs made to extend
 an asset's useful life beyond that which was originally
 estimated.

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"(6) GENERAL OFFICE. Those general and
 administrative offices of the State Department of
 Transportation located in Montgomery, Alabama.

4 "(7) ROAD MACHINERY AND EQUIPMENT. Self-propelled
5 equipment or other equipment commonly referred to in the State
6 Department of Transportation as rental equipment, including
7 aircraft.

8 "(8) SALVAGE VALUE. That portion of a unit of road 9 machinery and equipment's cost that is recovered at the end of 10 its productive life.

11 "(c) There is created in the Public Road and Bridge Fund of the State Department of Transportation an Equipment 12 13 Management Surplus Reserve Account. The director of the 14 department is directed to establish a road machinery and equipment management program which shall determine the type, 15 16 number, and distribution between the general office and 17 department divisions of the road machinery and equipment 18 necessary to carry out the mission of the State Department of 19 Transportation in an efficient manner. This system shall also determine the productive life of all of the road machinery and 20 21 equipment and establish depreciation rates, equipment 22 replacement allowance, and salvage value which, when 23 accumulated in the Equipment Management Surplus Reserve 24 Account, will provide the necessary funds to upgrade, replace, 25 or make extraordinary repairs to road machinery and equipment.

"(d) The Equipment Management Surplus Reserve 1 Account shall be subdivided into subaccounts as follows: One 2 3 for the general office and one each for each of the department divisions. Depreciation, equipment replacement allowance, and 4 5 salvage value shall be credited to the account of the general office or department division to which the unit of road 6 machinery and equipment is assigned and shall not be 7 8 commingled or transferred between the department division and the general office. The funds in each of these subaccounts of 9 10 the general office and department divisions shall be available to the appropriate office or division to upgrade, replace, or 11 to make extraordinary repairs to road machinery and equipment. 12

13 "(e) There is appropriated all of the funds created 14 to the Equipment Management Surplus Reserve Accounts, due to 15 the depreciation, equipment replacement allowance, and salvage 16 value of road machinery and equipment, for upgrading, 17 replacement, or extraordinary repairs to road machinery and 18 equipment. These funds shall not revert at the end of each 19 fiscal year, but shall carry over to each succeeding year. It is the intent of the Legislature that funds appropriated from 20 21 the Equipment Management Surplus Reserve Account be used only 22 to upgrade, replace, or make extraordinary repairs to road machinery and equipment, and that they not be used to increase 23 24 the number of units of equipment of the State Department of 25 Transportation. It is the further intent of the Legislature to

use these funds to maintain the present level of road 1 2 maintenance, as opposed to using the funds to place the state 3 in a competitive position with private enterprise. Specific funds shall be appropriated by the Legislature to increase the 4 number of units of road machinery and equipment. It is 5 specifically provided that the aircraft, pickup truck, and 6 7 three automobiles transferred from the Department of Finance 8 to the State Department of Transportation, pursuant to Executive Order No. 12, dated December 21, 1993, shall be 9 10 added to and become a part of the Department of Transportation road machinery and equipment management program and Equipment 11 Management Surplus Reserve Account. 12

13 "(f) Any other provision of law to the contrary 14 notwithstanding, at the end of the productive life of a unit 15 of road machinery or equipment covered by the equipment 16 management surplus reserve account established as provided for 17 in this section, the unit of road machinery or equipment shall be sold at the discretion of the director, either at public 18 19 auction, as provided for by the laws of the State of Alabama, 20 or by a negotiated sale between the State Department of 21 Transportation and any other state department or agency, and 22 the proceeds from any sale, whether at public auction or by 23 such negotiation, shall be paid into the equipment management 24 surplus reserve account and credited to the subaccount to 25 which the unit of road machinery or equipment is credited.

"(g) The department may develop a fleet management 1 program for the state which will operate in a similar manner 2 3 as the department's Equipment Management Program. "§41-17A-6. 4 5 "(a) In order to ensure compliance with the goals outlined in Section 41-17A-4, as well as to monitor the 6 actions outlined in Section 41-17A-5, a Green Fleets Review 7 8 Committee is created. The Permanent Joint Legislative 9 Committee on Energy will appoint the members of the Green 10 Fleets Review Committee. The membership of the committee shall reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural and 11 economic diversity of the state. The Chair of the Green Fleets 12 13 Review Committee may create advisory subcommittees and appoint 14 members thereto, which may include members of the Green Fleets 15 Review Committee, representatives from governmental agencies, 16 and members of the public with interest and expertise in the 17 objectives of the committee. The Green Fleets Review Committee shall create no more than two active advisory subcommittees at 18 19 any given time unless the committee votes unanimously for additional subcommittees. 20

"(b) The committee shall thereafter meet at the call of the chair or any majority of the members thereof; provided, that the committee shall meet at least once each four months. The committee shall have a continuing existence and may meet, act, and conduct its business at any place within this state

during the sessions of the Legislature or any recess thereof,
 and in the interim period between sessions.

3 "(c) Each legislative member of the committee or any subcommittee, if created, shall be entitled to his or her 4 5 regular legislative compensation, his or her per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of 6 7 the committee. Upon requisitions signed by the chair of the 8 committee or subcommittees, these payments shall be paid out 9 of any funds appropriated to the use of the Legislature by 10 means of warrants drawn by the Comptroller on the State Treasury. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no member shall 11 receive additional legislative compensation or per diem when 12 13 the Legislature is in session or if a member is being paid any 14 other payments on the same dates for attendance on other state 15 business. The total legislative expenditures of the committee 16 shall not exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000) per fiscal 17 year.

18 "(d) On an annual basis, all state department and 19 agency fleet managers shall submit a draft of their green 20 fleets plan to the State Equipment Management Coordinator, or 21 the Department of Finance designee for this position 22 Department of Transportation Office of Fleet Management, and 23 the Green Fleets Review Committee detailing how vehicle 24 procurement, fleet operations, and employee travel activity are intended to conform to the green fleet policies and 25

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strategies outlined in Section 41-17A-5. Each green fleets
 plan submitted shall also include, as an appendix or addendum,
 an updated fleet vehicle inventory list in the same format as
 the fleet vehicle inventory required by Section 41-17A-3.

5 "(e) Each green fleets plan shall be reviewed by the 6 State Equipment Management Coordinator, or the Department of 7 Finance designee for this position Department of 8 Transportation Office of Fleet Management, and the committee for overall conformity with the policies and for completeness 9 10 in addressing the green fleets strategies. Inadequate plans shall be returned to the submitting department or agency for 11 revision and discussion with the committee. 12

13 "(f) Any appeal of the committee's decisions must be 14 made in writing to the committee accompanied by appropriate documentation. Valid reasons for an appeal include 15 16 unavailability of appropriate fleet vehicles, incremental 17 costs in excess of the full life-cycle savings that would accrue from the acquisition of a given vehicle, and the 18 19 primacy of a given vehicle's mission to public safety or a 20 similar area judged to be applicable by the committee.

"(g) Approval of vehicle procurement requests for each department or agency is contingent upon a satisfactory recommendation from the State Fleet Manager as to the merit of the department's or agency's green fleets plan.

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"(h) The most innovative green fleets plan 1 implemented shall receive recognition in an annual award to 2 3 the department or agency submitting the most innovative plan. 4 The committee shall determine the recipient of the award 5 during the annual green fleets review meeting." Section 2. Chapter 17, Title 41 of the Code of 6 Alabama 1975, consisting of Sections 41-17-1 to 41-17-9, 7 8 inclusive, is repealed effective October 1, 2014. All personnel, facilities, property, equipment, and funds 9 10 assigned, allocated, or appropriated to the Department of 11 Finance, Division of Service for the operation of a 12 transportation pool or the maintenance and repair of 13 state-owned or operated automobiles shall transfer to the 14 Alabama Department of Transportation, effective October 1, 2014. 15 Section 3. This act shall become effective 16

16 Section 3. This act shall become effective
 17 immediately following its passage and approval by the
 18 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
