HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 22-1019

101 CONCERNING THE DESIGNATION OF A PORTION OF COLORADO STATE

102 HIGHWAY 85 AS THE "PVT. JOE P. MARTINEZ MEMORIAL

WHEREAS, Joseph "Joe" P. Martinez was born in Taos, New
 Mexico, in 1920 to Jose Manuel Martinez and Maria Eduvigen Romo;
 and

WHEREAS, In 1927, when Joe was 7 years old, his parents moved
the family to Ault, Colorado; and

6 WHEREAS, Joe Martinez was drafted into the United States Army 7 in 1942 at the age of 22, and he shipped off to Camp Roberts in 8 California for basic training; and WHEREAS, Upon completing his training, Pvt. Martinez was
 assigned to Company K, 32nd Infantry, 7th Infantry Division. The 7th
 Infantry Division was part of the force that landed at Attu in the Aleutian
 Islands of Alaska; and

5 WHEREAS, The Japanese invaded the Aleutian Islands in June 6 1942, the first time American soil had been invaded by a foreign power 7 since the War of 1812, and held a key defensive position in the 8 snow-covered mountains between East Arm Holtz Bay and Chichagof 9 Harbor; and

WHEREAS, On May 26, 1943, after repeated efforts to drive the
enemy back, troop dispositions were readjusted, and a trial coordinated
attack by a reinforced battalion was launched; and

WHEREAS, In the face of severe hostile machine gun, rifle, and
mortar fire, Pvt. Martinez, an automatic rifleman, rose to his feet and
resumed his advance, occasionally stopping to urge his comrades on; and

WHEREAS, After a most difficult climb, Pvt. Martinez eliminated
resistance from part of the enemy position by Browning Automatic Rifle
Fire (BAR) fire and hand grenades, but this success only partially
completed the action; and

WHEREAS, The main Holtz-Chichagof Pass rose about 150 feet
higher, flanked by steep rocky ridges, and passage was barred by enemy
fire from either flank and from tiers of snow trenches in front; and

WHEREAS, Despite these obstacles, and knowing of their
 existence, Pvt. Martinez again led the troops on and up, personally
 silencing several trenches with BAR fire and ultimately reaching the pass
 itself; and

WHEREAS, Just below the rim of the pass, Pvt. Martinez
encountered a final enemy-occupied trench and, as he engaged in firing
into it, he was mortally wounded; and

WHEREAS, The pass, however, was taken, and its capture was a
key victory in defeating and driving the Japanese from United States soil;
and

33 WHEREAS, Pvt. Joe Martinez was posthumously awarded the

- Medal of Honor, the first Hispanic American to have received that award;
 now, therefore,
- Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-third
 General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:
- 5 (1) That the portion of Colorado State Highway 85 from the 6 intersection of Colorado State Highway 85 and 1st Street in Ault to the 7 intersection of Colorado State Highway 85 and E Main Avenue in Pierce 8 be designated as the "Pvt. Joe P. Martinez Memorial Highway".
- 9 (2) That the Colorado Department of Transportation may accept 10 and expend gifts, grants, and donations for the purposes of the initial 11 placement of signs to mark Colorado State Highway 85 from the 12 intersection of Colorado State Highway 85 and 1st Street in Ault to the 13 intersection of Colorado State Highway 85 and E Main Avenue in Pierce 14 as the "Pvt. Joe P. Martinez Memorial Highway".
- (3) That the Colorado Department of Transportation may explore
 a cooperative agreement with the Board of County Commissioners for
 Weld County for the maintenance of the signs marking the "Pvt. Joe P.
 Martinez Memorial Highway".
