A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To provide for a new homestead exemption from Paulding County school district ad valorem
- 2 taxes for educational purposes in an amount equal to the amount by which the current year
- 3 assessed value of a homestead exceeds the adjusted base year assessed value of such
- 4 homestead; to provide for definitions; to specify the terms and conditions of the exemption
- 5 and the procedures relating thereto; to provide for applicability; to provide for compliance
- 6 with constitutional requirements; to provide for a referendum, effective dates, automatic
- 7 repeal, mandatory execution of election, and judicial remedies regarding failure to comply;
- 8 to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 11 (a) As used in this Act, the term:
- 12 (1) "Ad valorem taxes for educational purposes" means all ad valorem taxes for
- educational purposes levied by, for, or on behalf of the Paulding County school district,
- except for any ad valorem taxes to pay interest on and to retire county school district
- bonded indebtedness.
- 16 (2) "Base year" means:

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(A) Between the 2020 and 2021 taxable years, the lowest assessed value of the homestead, including any final determination of value on appeal pursuant to Code Section 48-5-311 of the O.C.G.A., as amended, with respect to an exemption pursuant to this Act which is first granted to a person on such person's homestead in the 2025 taxable year or who thereafter reapplies for and is granted such exemption in the 2026 taxable year, or thereafter, solely because of a change in ownership to a joint tenancy with right of survival; or

(B) In all other cases, the taxable year immediately preceding the taxable year in which the exemption under this Act is first granted to the most recent owner of such homestead;

provided, however, that the tax commissioner shall adjust the base year assessed value annually by no greater than 50 percent of the annual inflationary index rate determined by the tax commissioner; provided, further, that, in any taxable year in which the assessed value of the homestead is less than the base year assessed value for the prior year, such year's lesser assessed value shall become the base year assessed value for the then-current year. The tax commissioner shall establish a method for determining annual inflationary index rates which reflect the effects of inflation and deflation on the cost of living for residents of the Paulding County school district for a given calendar year. Such method may utilize the Consumer Price Index, as reported by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor or any other similar index established by the federal government, if the tax commissioner determines that such federal index fairly reflects the effects of inflation and deflation on the cost of living for residents of the Paulding County school district. This exemption shall apply to taxes assessed on improvements to the homestead or additional land that is added to the homestead after January 1 of the base year, provided that the base year for assessing the value of such improvements or additions shall be the taxable year such improvements or additions were made. If any real property is removed from the homestead, the base year assessed value,

including any final determination of value on appeal pursuant to Code Section 48-5-311 of the O.C.G.A., as amended, shall be adjusted to reflect such removal and the exemption shall be recalculated accordingly. The value of that property in excess of such exempted

amount shall remain subject to taxation.

- 48 (3) "Homestead" means homestead as defined and qualified in Code Section 48-5-40 of 49 the O.C.G.A., as amended, with the additional qualification that it shall include only the 50 primary residence and not more than five contiguous acres of land immediately 51 surrounding such residence.
- 52 (b) Each resident of the Paulding County school district is granted an exemption on that 53 person's homestead from Paulding County school district ad valorem taxes for educational 54 purposes in an amount equal to the amount by which the current year assessed value of that 55 homestead exceeds the adjusted base year assessed value, including any final determination 56 of value on appeal pursuant to Code Section 48-5-311 of the O.C.G.A., as amended, of the 57 homestead. This exemption shall not apply to taxes assessed on improvements to the 58 homestead or additional land that is added to the homestead after January 1 of the base year. If any real property is removed from the homestead, the base year assessed value, including 59 60 any final determination of value on appeal pursuant to Code Section 48-5-311 of the 61 O.C.G.A., as amended, shall be adjusted to reflect such removal and the exemption shall be 62 recalculated accordingly. The value of that property in excess of such exempted amount
- 64 (c) The unremarried surviving spouse of the person who has been granted the exemption 65 provided for in subsection (b) of this section shall continue to receive the exemption provided 66 under subsection (b) of this section, so long as such unremarried surviving spouse continues 67 to occupy the residence as a homestead.
- (d) A person shall not receive the homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) of this
 section unless the person or person's agent files an application with the tax commissioner of
 Paulding County, giving such information relative to receiving such exemption as will enable

71 the tax commissioner to make a determination regarding the initial and continuing eligibility

- of such person for such exemption. The tax commissioner of Paulding County shall provide
- 73 application forms for this purpose.
- 74 (e) The exemption shall be claimed and returned as provided in Code Section 48-5-50.1 of
- 75 the O.C.G.A., as amended. The exemption shall be automatically renewed from year to year
- so long as the owner occupies the residence as a homestead. After a person has filed the
- proper application as provided in subsection (d) of this section, it shall not be necessary to
- 78 make application thereafter for any year and the exemption shall continue to be allowed to
- 79 such person. It shall be the duty of any person granted the homestead exemption under
- subsection (b) of this section to notify the tax commissioner of Paulding County in the event
- 81 that such person for any reason becomes ineligible for that exemption.
- 82 (f) The exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall not apply to or affect state
- 83 ad valorem taxes, county ad valorem taxes for county purposes, independent school district
- 84 ad valorem taxes for educational purposes, or municipal ad valorem taxes for municipal
- 85 purposes. The homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall be in
- 86 addition to and not in lieu of any other homestead exemption applicable to Paulding County
- 87 school district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes.
- 88 (g) The exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall apply to all taxable years
- 89 beginning on or after January 1, 2025.

90 SECTION 2.

- 91 In accordance with the requirements of Article VII, Section II of the Constitution of the State
- 92 of Georgia, this Act shall not become law unless it receives the requisite two-thirds' majority
- 93 vote in both the Senate and the House of Representatives.

94 SECTION 3.

The election superintendent of Paulding County shall call and conduct an election as provided in this section for the purpose of submitting this Act to the electors of the Paulding County school district for approval or rejection. The election superintendent shall conduct such election on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 2024, and shall issue the call and conduct such election as provided by general law. The election superintendent shall cause the date and purpose of the election to be published once a week for two weeks immediately preceding the date thereof in the official organ of Paulding County. The ballot shall have written or printed thereon the words:

"() YES Shall the Act be approved which provides a homestead exemption from

() NO Paulding County school district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes in an amount equal to the amount by which the current year assessed value, including any final determination of value on appeal pursuant to Code Section 48-5-311 of the O.C.G.A., as amended, of a homestead exceeds its adjusted base year assessed value, with the initial base year being the lowest assessed value between the 2020 and 2021 taxable years, provided that the base year assessed value, including any final determination of value on appeal pursuant to Code Section 48-5-311 of the O.C.G.A., as amended, of such homestead shall be adjusted annually by no greater than 50 percent of the annual inflationary index rate determined by the tax commissioner?"

All persons desiring to vote for approval of the Act shall vote "Yes," and those persons desiring to vote for rejection of the Act shall vote "No." If more than one-half of the votes cast on such question are for approval of the Act, Section 1 of this Act shall become of full force and effect on January 1, 2025. If the Act is not so approved or if the election is not conducted as provided in this section, Section 1 of this Act shall not become effective, and this Act shall be automatically repealed on the first day of January immediately following that election date. The expense of such election shall be borne by Paulding County. It shall

be the election superintendent's duty to certify the result thereof to the Secretary of State. The provisions of this section shall be mandatory upon the election superintendent and are not intended as directory. If the election superintendent fails or refuses to comply with this section, any elector of the Paulding County school district may apply for a writ of mandamus to compel the election superintendent to perform his or her duties under this section. If the court finds that the election superintendent has not complied with this section, the court shall fashion appropriate relief requiring the election superintendent to call and conduct such election on the date required by this section or on the next date authorized for special elections provided for in Code Section 21-2-540 of the O.C.G.A.

SECTION 4.

- Except as otherwise provided in Section 3 of this Act, this Act shall become effective upon
- its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.

SECTION 5.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
