A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 1 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 general provisions of professions and businesses, so as to provide for the issuance of licenses
- 3 by endorsement for certain professions; to change certain provisions related to expedited
- 4 licenses by endorsement for spouses of service members and transitioning service members;
- 5 to provide for licenses by endorsement for certain professions other than firefighters,
- 6 healthcare providers, and law enforcement officers; to establish qualifications for such
- 7 licenses by endorsement; to provide for definitions; to provide for exceptions and
- 8 applicability; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 9 purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 12 Chapter 1 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general
- provisions of professions and businesses, is amended by revising Code Section 43-1-35,
- 14 relating to expedited license by endorsement for spouse of active or transitioning members
- of the armed forces, as follows:

- 75 (d)(g) Nothing contained in this Code section shall be construed to invalidate, override,
- or amend any licensing compact entered into by the State of Georgia or to permit the
- issuance of a license without verification under Code Section 50-36-1."
