A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the Joint Study Committee on Critical Transportation Infrastructure Funding; and
- 2 for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, transportation is a critical component of Georgia's economic competitiveness
- 4 as a state; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Georgia is home to 15 Fortune 500 companies for whom transportation
- 6 infrastructure is a critical component; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Georgia is home to the world's busiest airport, fastest growing seaport, ninth
- 8 largest transit system, third largest freight rail network in the United States, and 6.5 million
- 9 drivers who travel 108.5 billion miles each year; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Georgia's elected leadership has demonstrated excellent resourcefulness and
- productivity with current resource levels by utilizing innovative finance and project delivery
- 12 mechanisms; and
- WHEREAS, transportation is a critical resource in providing high quality of life for the
- 14 residents of Georgia; and
- 15 WHEREAS, transportation is essential to commerce and the provision of goods and services
- 16 to the people across this state, to getting Georgia's citizens to the workplace and medical and
- 17 educational facilities, to the tourism industry, to the freight and logistics industry, and to
- 18 every facet of the lives of Georgia's citizens; and
- 19 WHEREAS, the federal government has demonstrated an increasing inability to deliver a
- 20 consistent, predictable transportation funding environment; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Georgia's growth rate is twice the national average; and

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WHEREAS, Georgia's transportation investment per capita is less than most of her regional

- 23 neighbors; and
- 24 WHEREAS, traffic congestion in Georgia is projected to increase by 25 percent in the next
- 25 seven years; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Georgia's transportation leadership has predicted that current funding levels can,
- 27 at best, cover 50 percent of our greatest needs; and
- 28 WHEREAS, new sources and methods of funding transportation projects are needed to allow
- 29 the transportation systems in Georgia to keep up with the needs of the population; and
- 30 WHEREAS, the General Assembly needs to study these issues to determine funding
- 31 mechanisms for road transportation projects in Georgia.
- 32 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 33 GEORGIA that there is created the Joint Study Committee on Critical Transportation
- 34 Infrastructure Funding to be composed of 16 members as follows:
- 35 (1) The chairperson of the House Committee on Transportation;
- 36 (2) The chairperson of the Senate Transportation Committee;
- 37 (3) The chairperson of the House Committee on Appropriations;
- 38 (4) The chairperson of the Senate Appropriations Committee;
- 39 (5) Three representatives and one citizen member appointed by the Speaker of the House
- 40 of Representatives;
- 41 (6) Three senators and one citizen member appointed by the President of the Senate;
- 42 (7) The president and chief executive officer of the Georgia Chamber of Commerce or
- 43 his or her designee;
- 44 (8) The president and chief executive officer of the Metro-Atlanta Chamber of
- 45 Commerce or his or her designee;
- 46 (9) The executive director of the Association County Commissioners of Georgia; and
- 47 (10) The executive director of the Georgia Municipal Association.
- 48 The chairperson of the House Committee on Transportation and the chairperson of the Senate
- 49 Transportation Committee shall serve as co-chairpersons of the committee. The
- 50 co-chairpersons shall call all meetings of the committee.
- 51 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall undertake a study of the conditions,
- 52 needs, issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and make specific legislative

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recommendations for consideration in the next legislative session. The committee may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution. Legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated. The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member of the committee for more than eight days unless additional days are authorized. The funds necessary to pay the allowances for members of the committee shall come from the funds appropriated to the House of Representatives and the Senate. The funds necessary to pay all other expenses incurred by the committee shall come from the private stakeholders serving on the committee. Those stakeholders are authorized and directed to provide the committee with such logistical, professional, and other support as the committee deems necessary to carry out the committee's duties under this resolution. The committee shall deliver legislative recommendations to the legislature by November 30, 2014, and shall stand abolished on December 1, 2014.
