## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing and commending the Georgia Aerospace Industry for its significant beneficial
- 2 impact on the people and economy of the State of Georgia; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Georgia is a world leader in aerospace as this state is home to more than 500
- 4 companies employing more than 84,000 Georgians; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Delta Air Lines is the world's second largest airline with headquarters in Atlanta
- 6 and half of its 60,000 member workforce located in Georgia; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Gulfstream Aerospace employs more than 7,000 highly skilled workers in
- 8 Savannah and Brunswick, and Lockheed Martin employs approximately 7,000 workers at
- 9 its Marietta plant; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Thrush and Maule operate aircraft manufacturing facilities in Albany and
- 11 Moultrie, respectively, while companies throughout this state manufacture key components
- 12 for major aircraft engine programs throughout the world; and
- WHEREAS, Georgia's aerospace industry is a world leader in aerospace exports; between
- 14 2002 and 2011, the value of Georgia's aerospace exports grew a remarkable 838 percent to
- over \$5.75 billion in 2011 (increasing over 30 percent just between 2010 and 2011), ranking
- 16 Georgia fourth among U.S. states; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Georgia is home to the world's busiest airport, Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta
- 18 International Airport, where aviation activities and transportation hubs contribute to the
- 19 employment of 471,175 people and \$62.6 billion in statewide total economic impact; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Georgia aerospace is a leader in the maintenance, repair, and overhaul (MRO),
- 21 of military and civil aircraft engines and equipment and is home to the largest MRO facility

in the U.S. (Delta TechOps) and one of the world's largest military MRO facilities (Warner

- 23 Robins Air Logistics Complex); and
- 24 WHEREAS, Georgia offers world class aerospace education programs and is a leader in
- 25 research and development through public and private universities conducting over \$60
- 26 million in specialized aerospace research and over \$500 million in general engineering
- 27 research annually; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Georgia's aerospace industry, academia, and state and local governments are
- 29 collaborating to make Georgia a leader in the rapidly expanding unmanned aerial vehicles
- 30 market, projected to exceed \$10 billion annually by 2021, by working with the Federal
- 31 Aviation Administration to develop the technologies and systems required to integrate
- 32 unmanned aerial vehicles into the National Air Space System.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 34 recognize the importance of the Georgia Aerospace Industry to the State of Georgia, support
- 35 efforts to maintain and strengthen the industry, and help to foster its continued growth within
- 36 the State of Georgia for the benefit of all Georgians.
- 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 38 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the Georgia Aerospace Advisory Council
- 39 of the Georgia Center of Innovation for Aerospace.
