A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing March 26, 2024, as Trans Liberation Day at the state capitol; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, we proudly recognize Community Estr(El/La) for their work and service in
- 4 educating communities about the challenges and contributions of transgender Georgians; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Community Estr(El/La) is a community-based organization led by immigrant,
- 6 Spanish-speaking (Black, Indigenous, Brown), and transgender individuals who are
- 7 dedicated to defending, organizing, and empowering the human rights of transgender
- 8 Georgians; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Trans Liberation Day is a significant observance dedicated to recognizing the
- 10 struggles and celebrating the achievements of the transgender community; and
- 11 WHEREAS, the transgender community has faced historical and ongoing challenges,
- 12 including violence, discrimination, and injustice; and
- 13 WHEREAS, there is still no comprehensive federal non-discrimination law that includes
- 14 gender identity; and

15 WHEREAS, twenty-nine percent of transgender adults live in poverty, as well as 39 percent

- of Black transgender adults, 48 percent of Latine transgender adults, and 35 percent of
- 17 Alaska Native, Asian, Native American, and Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander transgender
- 18 adults; and
- 19 WHEREAS, fifty-four percent of transgender people have experienced some form of
- 20 intimate partner violence, 47 percent have been sexually assaulted in their lifetime, and
- 21 nearly one in ten were physically assaulted; and
- 22 WHEREAS, twenty-seven percent of transgender people have been fired, not hired, or
- 23 denied a promotion due to their transgender identity; and
- 24 WHEREAS, twenty-two percent of transgender people and 32 percent of transgender people
- 25 of color have no health insurance coverage. More than one-quarter (29 percent) of
- transgender adults have been refused health care by a doctor or provider because of their
- 27 gender identity; and
- 28 WHEREAS, forty-nine percent of transgender adults and 55 percent of transgender adults
- 29 of color said they were unable to vote in at least one election in their lifetime because of fear
- 30 of experiencing discrimination at the polls; and
- 31 WHEREAS, there is no comprehensive state non-discrimination law that includes gender
- 32 identity for children, youth, and adults; and
- 33 WHEREAS, recognizing Trans Liberation Day serves as an opportunity to foster
- 34 understanding, inclusivity, and acceptance within our state; and

35 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia values and respects the diversity of its residents, including

- 36 those who identify as transgender.
- 37 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 38 recognize March 26, 2024, as Trans Liberation Day at the state capitol, an important
- 39 occasion to raise awareness about the experiences of transgender individuals and to promote
- 40 a more affirming, inclusive, and supportive state.
- 41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of this body encourage educational
- 42 institutions, businesses, and community organizations to participate in activities that promote
- 43 awareness and understanding of the transgender community.
- 44 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 45 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the public and the
- 46 press.
