## **SENATE BILL No. 256**

#### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 7.1-3; IC 7.1-5-7.

**Synopsis:** Minimum age for bartenders. Permits the employment of a person as a bartender who: (1) is at least 20 years of age but less than 21 years of age; and (2) has successfully completed an alcohol server training program. Makes conforming changes and a technical correction.

Effective: July 1, 2022.

### SENATE BILL No. 256

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning alcohol and tobacco.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 7.1-3-6-3.8, AS ADDED BY P.L.214-2016,
2	SECTION 6, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2022]: Sec. 3.8. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision in
4	this chapter, the commission may issue a temporary beer permit if all
5	the following apply:
6	(1) The temporary beer permit is issued for a festival or event that
7	meets all the following:
8	(A) The festival or event promotes, at least in part, been
9	manufactured at a brewery described in IC 7.1-3-2-7(5).
0	(B) The anticipated attendance of the festival or event is at
1	least seven thousand five hundred (7,500) people.
2	(C) Adequate security measures will be provided at the festival
3	or event.
4	(D) Individuals less than twenty-one (21) years of age will not
5	be allowed to attend the festival or event, unless the
6	individual is employed by the applicant for the temporary
7	beer permit as a bartender under IC 7.1-5-7-13(a)(5).

7	area at a festival or event that is enclosed by fencing, barricades, or
8	structures. The area may be an outside area that is contiguous to a
9	brewery described in IC 7.1-3-2-7(5) or restaurant or at another
10	location that is not on or near the premises of a brewery or restaurant.
11	(c) The commission may issue a temporary beer permit under this
12	
13	section for a term, up to and including, three (3) days from its issuance.
13	(d) The commission may not issue a temporary beer permit under
15	this section to any one (1) person more than two (2) times in a calendar
16	year.  (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this title, the helder of
17	(e) Notwithstanding any other provision of this title, the holder of
18	the temporary beer permit may allow an individual who attends the
	festival or event to carry beer, in a quantity that does not exceed a total
19	of two hundred eighty-eight (288) ounces, into the permitted area. Beer
20	carried in to a festival or event under this subsection may be consumed
21	or traded only in the permitted area.
22	(f) An individual who attends the festival or event may carry out
23	beer in sealed, unopened containers from the temporary beer permit
24	area.
25	SECTION 2. IC 7.1-3-9.5-3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.194-2021,
26	SECTION 39, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
27	JULY 1, 2022]: Sec. 3. (a) The holder of a supplemental caterer's
28	permit is entitled to purchase alcoholic beverages only from:
29	(1) a brewery as described in IC 7.1-3-2-7(5)(N);
30	(2) a farm winery as described in IC 7.1-3-12-5(a)(12); and
31	(3) any other permittee entitled to sell to the holder under this
32	title.
33	Except as provided in IC 7.1-3-6.1 and IC 7.1-3-6.2, the holder of a
34	supplemental caterer's permit is entitled to sell alcoholic beverages
35	only for on-premises consumption at those locations approved by the
36	commission and at times lawful under the holder's retailers' permits.
37	Except as provided in IC 7.1-3-6.1 and IC 7.1-3-6.2, the holder of a
38	supplemental caterer's permit is not entitled to sell alcoholic beverages
39	at wholesale, nor for carry-out or at-home delivery.
40	(b) The holder of a supplemental caterer's permit may employ
41	a person as a bartender who:
42	(1) is at least twenty (20) years of age but less than twenty-one

4	(b) (c) If permitted by the state fair commission under
5	IC 7.1-3-21-14, a brewery under IC 7.1-3-2-7(5), a farm winery under
6	IC 7.1-3-12, or an artisan distillery under IC 7.1-3-27 may sell their
7	own products to consumers for consumption off the state fair grounds
8	under IC 7.1-3-21-14(b)(3), including at a location on the property of
9	the state fair grounds for which a supplemental caterer's permit has
10	been approved.
11	SECTION 3. IC 7.1-3-18-11, AS AMENDED BY P.L.224-2005,
12	SECTION 9, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
13	JULY 1, 2022]: Sec. 11. (a) The commission may issue a temporary
14	bartender's permit to any person who is at least twenty-one (21) twenty
15	(20) years of age for any of the following purposes:
16	(1) To be a bartender at any activity or event for which a
17	temporary permit is issued under IC 7.1-3-6 (beer) or IC 7.1-3-16
18	(wine).
19	(2) To be a bartender at a nonprofit club for a maximum of four
20	(4) days in a year during the same time that a fair or festival is
21	held in the community where the club is located. However, the
22	commission may only issue a maximum of twenty (20) temporary
23	bartender's licenses for use in one (1) club during one (1) fair or
24	festival.
25	(b) A temporary bartender's permit is the only license that is
26	required for persons to serve as bartenders for the purposes described
27	in subsection (a).
28	(c) A temporary bartender at a club may dispense any alcoholic
29	beverage that the club's permit allows the club to serve.
30	(d) The fee for a temporary bartender's permit is five dollars (\$5).
31	(e) The commission may by rule provide procedures for the issuance
32	of a temporary bartender's permit.
33	(f) The commission shall revoke a permit issued to a bartender
34	under this section if the bartender is convicted of a Class B
35	misdemeanor for violating IC 7.1-5-10-15(a).
36	SECTION 4. IC 7.1-5-7-7, AS AMENDED BY P.L.159-2014,
37	SECTION 49, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
38	JULY 1, 2022]: Sec. 7. (a) Subject to IC 7.1-5-1-6.5, it is a Class C
39	misdemeanor for a minor to knowingly:
40	(1) possess an alcoholic beverage;
41	(2) consume an alcoholic beverage; or
42	(3) transport an alcoholic beverage on a public highway when not



1	accompanied by at least one (1) of the minor's parents or
2	guardians.
3	(b) Subsection (a)(1) does not apply to a minor who:
4	(1) is at least twenty (20) years of age; and
5	(2) possesses an alcoholic beverage in the scope of the minor's
6	employment as a bartender under section 13(a)(5) of this
7	chapter.
8	(b) (c) If a minor is found to have violated subsection (a)(2) or
9	(a)(3) while operating a vehicle, the court may order the minor's driving
10	privileges suspended for up to one (1) year. However, if the minor is
11	less than eighteen (18) years of age, the court shall order the minor's
12	driving privileges suspended for at least sixty (60) days.
13	(c) (d) The court shall deliver any order suspending a minor's
14	driving privileges under this section to the bureau of motor vehicles
15	which shall suspend the minor's driving privileges under
16	IC 9-24-18-12.2 for the period ordered by the court.
17	SECTION 5. IC 7.1-5-7-10, AS AMENDED BY P.L.159-2014
18	SECTION 51, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
19	JULY 1, 2022]: Sec. 10. (a) It is a Class C infraction for a minor to
20	knowingly or intentionally be in a tavern, bar, or other public place
21	where alcoholic beverages are sold, bartered, exchanged, given away
22	provided, or furnished. This subsection does not apply to a minor
23	who is:
24	(1) at least twenty (20) years of age; and
25	(2) in a tavern, bar, or other public place described in this
26	subsection while acting within the scope of the minor's
27	employment as a bartender under section 13(a)(5) of this
28	chapter.
29	(b) It is a Class C misdemeanor for a permittee to recklessly permi
30	a minor to be in the prohibited place beyond a reasonable time in which
31	an ordinary prudent person can check identification to confirm the age
32	of a patron. This subsection does not apply to a permittee if the
33	minor is:
34	(1) at least twenty (20) years of age; and
35	(2) in the place described in this subsection while acting within
36	the scope of the minor's employment as a bartender under
37	section 13(a)(5) of this chapter.
38	SECTION 6. IC 7.1-5-7-11, AS AMENDED BY P.L.150-2021
39	SECTION 5, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
40	JULY 1, 2022]: Sec. 11. (a) The provisions of sections 9 and 10 of this
41	chapter shall not apply if the public place involved is one (1) of the
42	following:
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1	(1) Civic center.
2	(2) Convention center.
3	(3) Sports arena.
4	(4) Bowling center.
5	(5) Bona fide club.
6	(6) Drug store.
7	(7) Grocery store.
8	(8) Boat.
9	(9) Dining car.
10	(10) Pullman car.
11	(11) Club car.
12	(12) Passenger airplane.
13	(13) Horse racetrack facility holding a recognized meeting permit
14	under IC 4-31-5.
15	(14) Satellite facility (as defined in IC 4-31-2-20.5).
16	(15) Catering hall under IC 7.1-3-20-24 that is not open to the
17	public.
18	(16) That part of a restaurant which is separate from a room in
19	which is located a bar over which alcoholic beverages are sold or
20	dispensed by the drink.
21	(17) Entertainment complex.
22	(18) Indoor golf facility.
23	(19) A recreational facility such as a golf course, bowling center,
24	or similar facility that has the recreational activity and not the sale
25	of food and beverages as the principal purpose or function of the
26	person's business.
27	(20) A licensed premises owned or operated by a postsecondary
28	educational institution described in IC 21-17-6-1.
29	(21) An automobile racetrack.
30	(22) An indoor theater under IC 7.1-3-20-26.
31	(23) A senior residence facility campus (as defined in
32	IC 7.1-3-1-29(c)) at which alcoholic beverages are given or
33	furnished as provided under IC 7.1-3-1-29.
34	(24) A hotel other than a part of a hotel that is a room in a
35	restaurant in which a bar is located over which alcoholic
36	beverages are sold or dispensed by the drink.
37	(25) The location of an allowable event to which IC 7.1-3-6.1
38	applies.
39	(26) The location of a charity auction to which IC 7.1-3-6.2
40	applies.
41	(27) A tour of a brewery as provided in IC 7.1-3-20-16.4, if the
42	minor is in the company of a parent, legal guardian or custodian,



1	or family member who is at least twenty-one (21) years of age.
2	(28) A farm winery and any additional locations of the farm
3	winery under IC 7.1-3-12, if the minor is in the company of a
4	parent, legal guardian or custodian, or family member who is at
5	least twenty-one (21) years of age and the minor is accompanied
6	by the adult in any area that the adult may be present whether or
7	not the area:
8	(A) is separated in any manner from where the wine is
9	manufactured, sold, or consumed within the farm winery
10	premises; or
11	(B) operates under a retailer's permit.
12	(29) An artisan distillery under IC 7.1-3-27, if:
13	(A) the person who holds the artisan distiller's permit also
14	holds a farm winery permit under IC 7.1-3-12, or
15	IC 7.1-3-20-16.4(a) applies to the person; and
16	(B) the minor is in the company of a parent, legal guardian or
17	custodian, or family member who is at least twenty-one (21)
18	years of age.
19	(30) An art instruction studio under IC 7.1-5-8-4.6.
20	(31) The licensed premises of a food hall under IC 7.1-3-20-29
21	and the food and beverage vending space of a food hall vendor
22	permittee under IC 7.1-3-20-30. However, sections 9 and 10 of
23	this chapter apply to a bar within the food and beverage vending
24	space of a food hall vendor permittee under IC 7.1-3-20-30 that
25	serves alcoholic beverages intended to be consumed while sitting
26	or standing at the bar.
27	(32) A bar area, if the minor:
28	(A) is at least twenty (20) years of age;
29	(B) meets the requirements of section 13(a)(5) of this
30	chapter; and
31	(C) is in the bar area while acting within the scope of the
32	minor's employment as a bartender.
33	(b) For the purpose of this subsection, "food" means meals prepared
34	on the licensed premises. It is lawful for a minor to be on licensed
35	premises in a room in which is located a bar over which alcoholic
36	beverages are sold or dispensed by the drink if all the following
37	conditions are met:
38	(1) The minor is eighteen (18) years of age or older.
39	(2) The minor is in the company of a parent, guardian, or family
40	member who is twenty-one (21) years of age or older.
41	(3) The purpose for being on the licensed premises is the
42	consumption of food and not the consumption of alcoholic



1	beverages.
2	SECTION 7. IC 7.1-5-7-13, AS AMENDED BY P.L.270-2017,
3	SECTION 20, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
4	JULY 1, 2022]: Sec. 13. (a) Section 12 of this chapter does not prohibit
5	the following:
6	(1) The employment of a person at least eighteen (18) years of age
7	but less than twenty-one (21) years of age on or about licensed
8	premises where alcoholic beverages are sold, furnished, or given
9	away for consumption either on or off the licensed premises, for
10	a purpose other than:
11	(A) selling;
12	(B) furnishing, other than serving;
13	(C) consuming; or
14	(D) otherwise dealing in;
15	alcoholic beverages.
16	(2) A person at least nineteen (19) years of age but less than
17	twenty-one (21) years of age from ringing up a sale of alcoholic
18	beverages in the course of the person's employment.
19	(3) A person who is at least nineteen (19) years of age but less
20	than twenty-one (21) years of age and who has successfully
21	completed an alcohol server training program certified under
22	IC 7.1-3-1.5 from serving alcoholic beverages in a dining area or
23	family room of a restaurant or hotel:
24	(A) in the course of a person's employment as a waiter,
25	waitress, or server; and
26	(B) under the supervision of a person who:
27	(i) is at least twenty-one (21) years of age;
28	(ii) is present at the restaurant or hotel; and
29	(iii) has successfully completed an alcohol server training
30	program certified under IC 7.1-3-1.5 by the commission.
31	This subdivision does not allow a person at least nineteen (19)
32	years of age but less than twenty-one (21) years of age to be a
33	bartender.
34	(4) The employment of a person at least eighteen (18) years of age
35	but less than twenty-one (21) years of age on or about licensed
36	premises where alcoholic beverages are sold, furnished, or given
37	away for consumption either on or off the licensed premises if all
38	the following apply:
39	(A) The person is employed as an assistant on a delivery truck.
40	(B) The person's duties with respect to alcoholic beverages are
41	limited to handling alcoholic beverages in connection with the
42	loading, unloading, stowing, or storing of alcoholic beverages



1	that are being delivered or picked up.
2	(C) The person does not sell, furnish, or deal in alcoholic
3	beverages in any manner except as expressly permitted under
4	clause (B).
5	(D) The person acts under the supervision of a driver holding
6	a salesman's permit.
7	(E) The person does not collect money for the delivery or pick
8	up.
9	(5) Notwithstanding subdivision (3), the employment of a
10	person as a bartender who:
l 1	(A) is at least twenty (20) years of age but less than
12	twenty-one (21) years of age; and
13	(B) has successfully completed an alcohol server training
14	program certified under IC 7.1-3-1.5.
15	(b) This chapter does not prohibit a person less than twenty-one (21)
16	years of age from being on the premises of a brewery under
17	IC 7.1-3-2-7(5), a farm winery, including any additional locations of
18	the farm winery under IC 7.1-3-12-5, or an artisan distillery under
19	IC 7.1-3-27-5, if the person is:
20	(1) the child, stepchild, grandchild, nephew, or niece of an owner
21	of the:
22	(A) brewery;
23	(B) farm winery; or
24	(C) artisan distiller; and
25 26	(2) employed on the premises for a purpose other than:
26	(A) selling;
27	(B) furnishing, other than serving;
28	(C) consuming; or
29	(D) otherwise dealing in;
30	alcoholic beverages.
31	A minor described in this subsection is not required to be accompanied
32	by a parent, legal guardian or custodian, or family member who is at
33	least twenty-one (21) years of age while on the premises of the brewery
34	or farm winery.
35	SECTION 8. IC 7.1-5-7-15 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
36	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2022]: Sec. 15. (a) A person
37	twenty-one (21) years of age or older who knowingly or intentionally
38	encourages, aids, or induces a minor to unlawfully possess an alcoholic
39	beverage commits a Class C infraction.
10	(b) This section does not apply to the possession of an alcoholic
11	beverage by a minor who:
12	(1) is at least twenty (20) years of age; and



1	(2) possessed the alcoholic beverage in the scope of the
2	minor's employment as a bartender under section 13(a)(5) of
3	this chapter.
