MADAM PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

A SENATE RESOLUTION urging the Legislative Council to assign to an appropriate study committee the topic of the effectiveness of awarding time off of sentences for individuals serving sentences at the Indiana Department of Corrections (DOC) participating in the Case Plan Credit Time (CPCT) Program.

7 Whereas, In 2020, the Indiana General Assembly passed 8 House Enrolled Act (HEA) 1120 concerning the award of credit 9 time to persons in DOC for progress in meeting the goals of 10 individualized case management plans to provide incentives for 11 those persons to engage in programming to reduce rates of 12 recidivism;

Whereas, HEA 1120 required DOC to submit a report to
the Legislative Council before May 1, 2023, concerning results
of the implementation of the CPCT Program during 2022;

Whereas, In 2022, over 18,000 individuals incarcerated
within DOC participated in individualized case management
plans under the CPCT Program, amounting to over 82% of the
incarcerated population;

Whereas, Although a significant percentage of incarcerated 1 individuals participated in the CPCT Program, the report 2 submitted by DOC indicated that the effects of the program 3 were yet to be fully realized; and 4 Whereas, Without further study, the Indiana General 5 Assembly and DOC cannot evaluate the efficacy of the CPCT 6 Program in reducing recidivism: Therefore, 7 Be it resolved by the Senate of the 8 General Assembly of the State of Indiana: 9 SECTION 1. That the Indiana Senate urges the Legislative 10 Council to assign to an appropriate study committee the topic 11 of the effectiveness of awarding time off of sentences for 12 individuals serving sentences at DOC participating in the CPCT 13 Program. 14 SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed 15 to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the members of the 16 Legislative Council. 17
