MILITARY AFFAIRS: Provides for death and disability benefits for La. National Guardsmen

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 23:1211, to enact R.S. 29:26.1, and to repeal R.S. 22:941(A)(5),
3	relative to the Louisiana National Guard; to provide for death benefits; to provide for
4	disability benefits; to provide definitions; to provide for eligibility of benefits; to
5	provide for exceptions; to provide for rulemaking; and to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 23:1211 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
8	§1211. Special compensation benefits for injury or death of member of national
9	guard
10	A. Except as provided by R.S. 22:941 R.S. 29:26.1, every member of the
11	national guard who is accidentally injured, or his dependents if he is accidentally
12	killed, while on active duty during a state of emergency declared by the governor and
13	for the duration of such emergency as declared by the governor, shall be
14	compensated by the state in accordance with the workers' compensation law,
15	including but not limited to such medical, surgical, and hospital services and
16	medicines and such disability and death benefits as are authorized by the workers'
17	compensation law.
18	B. Except as provided by R.S. 22:941 R.S. 29:26.1, no compensation shall
19	be paid unless the injury or death arose out of and in the course of service while on
20	active duty during a state of emergency declared by the governor and only for the

1	duration thereof and for no other kind of service whatsoever. Before any claim is
2	certified for payment, proof that the applicant is entitled to payment shall be made
3	in accordance with regulations prescribed by the adjutant general. The amount
4	payable as compensation may be commuted to a lump-sum settlement by agreement
5	of the parties. In computing the weekly benefit hereunder, either the weekly wages
6	from the member's principal civilian employment or his weekly military wages,
7	whichever is larger, will be used. Otherwise, the provisions of the workers'
8	compensation law apply.
9	C. Except as provided in Subsection B of this Section and R.S. 22:941 R.S.
10	29:26.1, the provisions of this Section and of no other law shall govern the
11	compensation benefits payable to members of the national guard.
12	Section 2. R.S. 29:26.1 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
13	<u>§26.1. Death and disability benefits; Louisiana National Guard</u>
14	A. For purposes of this Section, the following definitions shall apply:
15	(1) "Beneficiary" means the person designated by the guardsman on the DD
16	Form 93 who receives the death benefit from the United States Department of
17	Defense pursuant to 10 U.S.C. 1475, unless otherwise designated by the guardsman
18	in a Death Benefit Beneficiary Designation form pursuant to administrative rule.
19	(2) "Federal active duty" means the period of time in which the president of
20	the United States orders a guardsman to federal active duty pursuant to 10 U.S.C.
21	<u>12301, 12302, or 12303 or 32 U.S.C. 502(f)(2)(A).</u>
22	(3) "Guardsman" means an officer or enlisted member of the Louisiana
23	National Guard.
24	(4) "Qualifying disability" means a one hundred percent permanent total
25	disability rating, or a permanent and total unemployability disability rating as
26	determined by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs and certified by the
27	secretary of the Louisiana Department of Veterans Affairs, or his designee, in a final
28	adjudication of the initial rating decision, or as determined or certified by the proper

1	state entity that adjudicates such claims for guardsmen in accordance with worker's
2	compensation laws of this state.
3	(5) "State active duty" means the period of time in which the governor of this
4	state orders a guardsman to active duty pursuant to R.S. 29:7.
5	B.(1)(a) The beneficiary of a guardsman who is killed or has otherwise died
6	in the line of duty while on state or federal active duty shall be entitled to benefits
7	in the amount of two hundred fifty thousand dollars.
8	(b) A guardsman who has a qualifying disability due to injuries suffered in
9	the line of duty while on state or federal active duty shall be entitled to benefits in
10	the amount of one hundred thousand dollars.
11	(2) No guardsman shall be eligible to receive benefits pursuant to the
12	provisions of this Section if any of the following occur:
13	(a) An investigation determines that a guardsman who is injured, killed, or
14	has otherwise died was not in the line of duty at the time of death or injury.
15	(b) The guardsman is injured, killed, or has otherwise died while in any
16	training status pursuant to Title 29 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 or Title
17	32 of the United States Code, except training pursuant to 32 U.S.C. 502(f)(2)(A).
18	C. Claims for benefits pursuant to the provisions of this Section shall be
19	submitted in accordance with procedures established by administrative rule.
20	D. Eligibility determinations pursuant to the provisions of this Section shall
21	be made as follows:
22	(1) Eligibility for death benefits shall be determined by the adjutant general
23	or his designee.
24	(2) Eligibility for disability benefits shall be determined by the secretary of
25	the Louisiana Department of Veterans Affairs.
26	E. The Military Department shall adopt rules in accordance with the
27	Administrative Procedure Act to implement to the provisions of this Section.
28	Section 3. R.S. 22:941(A)(5) is hereby repealed in its entirety.

- 3 Section 5. Any death or disability benefits distributed to guardsmen or their
- 4 beneficiaries prior to the effective date of this Act shall not be affected by the provisions of
- 5 this Act.

Abstract: Provides for death and disability benefits, in the amount of \$250,000 and \$100,000 respectively, for members of the La. National Guard.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for death benefits in the amount of \$250,000 for a guardsman who is killed or has otherwise died in the line of duty while on state or federal active duty. Provides for disability benefits in the amount of \$100,000 for a guardsman who is disabled due to injuries suffered in the line of duty while on state or federal active duty.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the following exceptions:

- (1) The guardsman was not in the line of duty when he was injured, killed, or died.
- (2) The guardsman was in a training status when he was injured, killed, or died.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that eligibility determinations for death benefits shall be made by the adjutant general or his designee, and that eligibility determinations for disability benefits shall be made by the secretary of the La. Dept. of Veterans Affairs.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "beneficiary", "federal active duty", "guardsman", "qualifying disability", and "state active duty".

- 1. Changed the definition of "qualifying disability".
- 2. Clarified that <u>proposed law</u> applies when a guardsman is either killed or has otherwise died.
