| 2 | To enact R.S. 47:490.26, relative to military honor license plates; to provide for the |
| 3 | establishment of a military honor license plate for recipients of the Distinguished |
| 4 | Service Cross award; to require the secretary to promulgate rules and regulations |
| 5 | relative to the creation and implementation of this military honor license plate; to |
| 6 | provide for the creation, issuance, and design of such plates; and to provide for |
| 7 | related matters. |
| 8 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: |
| 9 | Section 1. R.S. 47:490.26 is hereby enacted to read as follows: |
| 10 | §490.26. Military honor license plates; "Distinguished Service Cross Recipient" |
| 11 | A. The secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall |
| 12 | establish a military honor license plate to be known as the "Distinguished Service |
| 13 | Cross Recipient" plate. |
| 14 | B. Upon application of a Distinguished Service Cross recipient, the secretary |
| 15 | of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall issue a military honor |
| 16 | license plate to be used in lieu of a regular motor vehicle registration plate. The |
| 17 | license plate shall be restricted to use on passenger cars, pickup trucks, recreational |
| 18 | vehicles, motorcycles, and vans. The "Distinguished Service Cross Recipient" plate |
| 19 | shall bear a likeness of the award centered on the left side of the license plate and the |
| 20 | words "Distinguished Service Cross Recipient" centered on the bottom of the plate |
| 21 | under the license plate number. |

| 4 | plate to be retained by the department to offset a portion of administrative costs. |
| 5 | D. The secretary shall adopt rules and regulations to implement the |
| 6 | provisions of this Section, including but not limited to rules governing the transfer |
| 7 | of license plates from one vehicle to another and the disposition of such license |
| 8 | plates. |
| 9 | E.(1) Any applicant who qualifies for the military honor license plate |
| 10 | authorized by this Section may be issued a license plate for each vehicle registered |
| 11 | in the applicant's name. |
| 12 | (2) Except as otherwise provided in this Paragraph, each military honor |
| 13 | license plate issued pursuant to this Section shall be returned to the secretary upon |
| 14 | the death of the person to whom the license plate was issued. A surviving spouse of |
| 15 | a person to whom a license plate was issued pursuant to this Section may retain a |
| 16 | license plate issued pursuant to this Section provided the surviving spouse has not |
| 17 | remarried and provided the surviving spouse applies to the secretary for a transfer |
| 18 | of the license plate to the surviving spouse. A military honor license plate |
| 19 | transferred pursuant to this Paragraph to a surviving spouse shall be returned to the |
| 20 | secretary upon the death or remarriage of the surviving spouse. |
