1 AN ACT 2 To amend and reenact R.S. 40:1299.28 and to enact R.S. 40:1299.27.1, relative to lead-free 3 pipes, fittings, fixtures, solder, or flux; to provide for the use, introduction into 4 commerce, and sale of certain pipes, fittings, fixtures, solder, or flux; to require lead-5 free pipes, fittings, fixtures, solder, or flux; to provide for exclusions; to provide for 6 labeling; to provide for definitions; to provide for the authority of the Department of 7 Health and Hospitals; to provide for enforcement; to provide for an effective date; 8 and to provide for related matters. 9 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 10 Section 1. R.S. 40:1299.28 is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 40:1299.27.1 11 is hereby enacted to read as follows: 12 §1299.27.1. Lead-free pipe, fitting, fixture, solder, or flux; exclusions; definitions 13 A.(1) No person shall use any pipe, pipe or plumbing fitting or fixture, solder, or flux that is not lead free in the installation or repair of any public water 14 15 system or any plumbing in a facility providing water for human consumption, except 16 when necessary for the repair of leaded joints of cast iron pipes. 17 (2) No person shall introduce into commerce any pipe, pipe or plumbing 18 fitting, or fixture intended to convey or dispense water for human consumption

2	faucets, and any other end-use devices intended to convey or dispense water for
3	human consumption through drinking or cooking.
4	(3) The provisions of this Subsection shall not apply to the following:
5	(a) Pipes, pipe fittings, plumbing fittings, or fixtures, including backflow
6	preventers, that are used exclusively for nonpotable services such as manufacturing,
7	industrial processing, irrigation, outdoor watering, or any other uses where the water
8	is not anticipated to be used for human consumption.
9	(b) Toilets, bidets, urinals, fill valves, flushometer valves, tub fillers, shower
10	valves, showers, safety shower flushes, service saddles, or water distribution main
11	gate valves that are two inches in diameter or larger.
12	(c) Materials purchased or acquired by public water systems prior to January
13	<u>1, 2013.</u>
14	B.(1) No person engaged in the business of selling plumbing supplies, except
15	a manufacturer, shall sell solder or flux that is not lead free.
16	(2) No person shall introduce into commerce any solder or flux that is not
17	lead free unless the solder or flux bears a prominent label stating that it is illegal to
18	use the solder or flux in the installation or repair of any plumbing providing water
19	for human consumption.
20	C. For the purposes of this Section, "lead free" means not more than 0.2
21	percent lead when used with respect to solder and flux and not more than a weighted
22	average of 0.25 percent when used with respect to the wetted surfaces of pipes and
23	pipe fittings, plumbing fittings, and fixtures. The weighted average lead content of
24	a pipe and pipe fitting, plumbing fitting, and fixture shall be calculated by using the
25	following formula: The percentage of lead content within each component that
26	comes into contact with water shall be multiplied by the percent of the total wetted
27	surface of the entire pipe and pipe fitting, plumbing fitting, or fixture represented in
28	each component containing lead. These percentages shall be added and the sum shall

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1	constitute the weighted average lead content of the pipe and pipe fitting, plumbing
2	fitting, or fixture.
3	D. All pipe, pipe or plumbing fittings or fixtures, solder, or flux shall be
4	certified by an independent American National Standards Institute (ANSI) accredited
5	third party as being in compliance with this Section.
6	E. The Department of Health and Hospitals shall promulgate rules and
7	regulations implementing the provisions of this Section.
8	§1299.28. Violations; enforcement
9	A. Any violation of R.S. 40:1299.26 and R.S. 40:1299.27, 1299.27, or
10	1299.27.1 may be treated by any party as a violation of the state, municipal, or
11	parochial health codes and all procedures and remedies applicable to such violations
12	of said the codes shall be available to correct, deter, or punish violations of said the
13	provisions. The district and appellate courts shall have jurisdiction to enforce the
14	said provisions to the same extent that said the courts have jurisdiction to enforce
15	said the codes.
16	B. All local health officers, health unit supervisors, or other code
17	enforcement agencies shall enforce R.S. 40:1299.26 and R.S. 40:1299.27, 1299.27,
18	and 1299.27.1 in the same manner and with the same authority as they may enforce
19	the health code.
20	C. The state health officer shall have concurrent responsibility and authority
21	to enforce R.S. 40:1299.26 and R.S. 40:1299.27, 1299.27, and 1299.27.1 and in so
