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SENATE BILL NO. 162

COMMERCIAL REGULATIONS. Provides for digital transaction providers to collect convenience charges, taxes and fees. (8/1/24)

AN ACT

2	To enact R.S. 47:532.4, relative to the office of motor vehicles; to provide relative to digital
3	transactions providers; to provide relative to the collection of registration and
4	renewal license taxes and fees; to provide relative to the collection of convenience
5	charges, taxes and fees; to provide relative to contracts with the office of motor
6	vehicles; to provide with respect to persons who perform services for the office of
7	motor vehicles; and to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 47:532.4 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
10	§532.4. Digital transaction provider
11	A.(1) The commissioner may enter into an agreement with public or
12	private persons or agencies for purposes of carrying out the provisions
13	authorized in R.S. 39:17.2, R.S. 39:17.5, and R.S. 39:17.6.
14	(2) The office of motor vehicles may deny a contract to any person,
15	natural or juridical, seeking to be a digital transaction provider if that person
16	has been found to be in violation of any rule or regulation promulgated by the
17	office of motor vehicles.

1	B.(1) Digital transaction provider may collect the registration and
2	renewal license taxes and fees associated with issuance of drivers license or
3	identification cards or for reinstatement of driving and motor vehicle
4	registration privileges.
5	(2) Digital transaction provider shall be authorized to collect a
6	convenience charge not to exceed the amount authorized by R.S. 47:532.1(C)
7	provided that the charges are disclosed immediately to the consumer prior to
8	the initiation of the transaction.
9	C. The commissioner may authorize the digital transaction provider to
10	process additional applications or transactions.
11	D. The contract between the Department of Public Safety and
12	Corrections, office of motor vehicles and a person who contracts to perform
13	services pursuant to this Section shall be for a term of two years and may be
14	automatically renewed by the Department of Public Safety and Corrections,
15	office of motor vehicles.
16	E.(1) Each digital transaction provider shall execute a good and
17	sufficient surety bond with a surety company qualified to do business in
18	Louisiana as a surety, in a sum of one hundred thousand dollars, if surety bond
19	is available for purchase, which bond shall name the Department of Public
20	Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles as obligee and shall be subject
21	to the condition that, if such digital transaction provider shall, throughout the
22	entire term of the bond, timely file with the office of motor vehicles all
23	applications delivered to the digital transaction provider for filing, and all fees
24	collected by such digital transaction provider, the obligation shall be void. If the
25	company does not do so, the obligation of the surety shall remain in full force
26	and effect.
27	(2) The surety bond furnished pursuant to this Paragraph shall be
28	delivered to and filed with the Department of Public Safety and Corrections,
29	office of motor vehicles.

F. Digital transaction provider shall obtain a Cyber Liability Insurance
with a company qualified to do business in Louisiana, in the amount of one
million dollars which names the state of Louisiana, the department, the
department's employees, the Office of Technology Services and its employee as
additional insureds.

G. The commissioner may promulgate rules necessary to implement
provisions of this Section.

SB 162 Original

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the commissioner may enter into an agreement with public or private persons or agencies for purposes of carrying out the provisions authorized in <u>present</u> law.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the office of motor vehicles may deny a contract to any person, natural or juridical, seeking to be a digital transaction provider if that person has been found to be in violation of any rule or regulation promulgated by the office of motor vehicles.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the digital transaction provider may collect the registration and renewal license taxes and fees associated with issuance of drivers license or identification cards or for reinstatement of driving and motor vehicle registration privileges.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the digital transaction provider shall be authorized to collect a convenience charge not to exceed the amount authorized by <u>present law</u> provided that the charges are disclosed immediately to the consumer prior to the initiation of the transaction.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the commissioner may authorize the digital transaction provider to process additional applications or transactions.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the contract between the DPSC (OMV) and a person who contracts to perform services pursuant to proposed law shall be for a term of two years and may be automatically renewed by the DPSC (OMV).

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that each digital transaction provider shall execute a good and sufficient surety bond with a surety company qualified to do business in La. as a surety, in a sum of \$100,000, if surety bond is available for purchase, which bond shall name the DPSC (OMV) as obligee and shall be subject to the condition that, if the digital transaction provider shall, throughout the entire term of the bond, timely file with the OMV all applications delivered to the digital transaction provider for filing, and all fees collected by the digital transaction provider, the obligation shall be void.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the surety bond furnished pursuant to <u>proposed law</u> shall be delivered to and filed with the DPSC (OMV).

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the digital transaction provider shall obtain a cyber liability insurance with a company qualified to do business in La., in the amount of \$1 million which names the state of La., the department, the department's employees, the Office of

Technology Services and its employee as additional insureds.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that commissioner may promulgate rules necessary to implement provisions of proposed law.
