17	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not

- 1 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
- 2 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
- 3 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
- 4 effective on the day following such approval.

Cortez (SB 421)

<u>Proposed law</u> provides the office of public health of the Department of Health and Hospitals shall promulgate the appropriate rules and regulations pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act requiring iron and manganese control for all community water systems.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides the maximum contaminant level in water from a community water system shall not exceed 0.3 milligrams per liter of iron and 0.05 milligrams per liter of manganese.
