2 Child Care Articles - Public Health - Containers of Infant Formula 3 Manufactured with Bisphenol-A - Prohibition

- 4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the State from purchasing infant formula in containers 5 containing a certain amount of bisphenol-A on or after a certain date; 6 prohibiting the manufacture, sale, or distribution of certain ehild care articles 7 containers of infant formula containing a certain amount of bisphenol-A on or 8 after a certain date; requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to 9 adopt certain regulations on or before a certain date; altering a certain 10 definition: making stylistic and conforming changes: authorizing the Secretary 11 of Health and Mental Hygiene to suspend implementation of certain provisions 12 of this Act under certain circumstances; requiring the Department to make a certain report to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a 13 certain date; and generally relating to prohibitions on containers of infant 14 15 formula and bisphenol-A in child care articles.
