2 (a) The county commissioners may issue a permit to an organization 3 specified in subsection (c) of this section to use two or more of the following gaming 4 devices in conducting a fundraiser at which a prize of merchandise or money may be 5 awarded:

- 6 (1) a paddle wheel;
- 7 (2) a wheel of fortune;
- 8 (3) a chance book;
- 9 (4) a card game;
- 10 (5) a raffle; or
- 11 (6) any other gaming device.

12 (b) Unless conducted at an event requiring a permit under subsection (a) of 13 this section, a raffle is not a multiple gaming device regulated under this section.

- 14 (c) (1) In this subsection, "charity" means an organization, institution, 15 association, society, or corporation that is exempt from taxation under § 501(c)(3) of 16 the Internal Revenue Code.
- 17 (2) The county commissioners may issue a permit to use multiple 18 gaming devices to:
- (i) a bona fide religious organization that has conducted
 religious services at the same location in the county for at least 3 years before applying
 for a permit;
- (ii) a county-supported or municipally supported volunteer fire
 company or an auxiliary unit whose members are directly associated with the
 volunteer fire company or auxiliary unit;
- (iii) a nationally chartered veterans' organization or an auxiliary
 unit whose members are directly associated with the veterans' organization;
- (iv) for the purpose of conducting a fundraiser for the benefit of a
 charity located in the county, a bona fide:
- 29 1. fraternal organization;
- 30 2. educational organization;
