To repeal section 160.254, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to higher education.

AN ACT

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 160.254, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 160.254, to read as follows:

160.254. 1. There is hereby established a joint committee of the general assembly, which shall be known as the "Joint Committee on Education", which shall be composed of seven members of the senate and seven members of the house of representatives. The senate members of the committee shall be appointed by the president pro tem of the senate and the house members by the speaker of the house.

7 2. The committee shall meet at least twice a year. In the event of three
8 consecutive absences on the part of any member, such member may be removed
9 from the committee.

3. The committee shall select either a chairman or cochairmen, one of
whom shall be a member of the senate and one a member of the house. A
majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. Meetings of the committee
may be called at such time and place as the chairman or chairmen designate.

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4. The committee shall:

(1) Review and monitor the progress of education in the state's publicschools and institutions of higher education;

(2) Receive reports from the commissioner of education concerning the
public schools and from the commissioner of higher education concerning
institutions of higher education;

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20 (3) Conduct a study and analysis of the public school system;

(4) Make recommendations to the general assembly for legislative action;

(5) Conduct an in-depth study concerning all issues relating to the equity and adequacy of the distribution of state school aid, teachers' salaries, funding for school buildings, and overall funding levels for schools and any other education funding-related issues the committee deems relevant;

(6) Monitor the establishment of performance measures as required by
section 173.1006 and report on their establishment to the governor and the
general assembly;

29 (7) Conduct studies and analysis regarding:

30 (a) The higher education system, including financing public higher31 education and the provision of financial aid for higher education; and

32 (b) The feasibility of including students enrolled in proprietary schools,
33 as that term is defined in section 173.600, in all state-based financial aid
34 programs;

35 (8) Annually review the collection of information under section 173.093
36 to facilitate a more accurate comparison of the actual costs at public and private
37 higher education institutions;

(9) Within three years of August 28, 2007, review a new model for the
funding of public higher education institutions upon submission of such model by
the coordinating board for higher education;

(10) Within three years of August 28, 2007, review the impact of the
higher education student funding act established in sections 173.1000 to
173.1006;

44 (11) Beginning August 28, 2008, upon review, approve or deny any
45 expenditures made by the commissioner of education pursuant to section 160.530,
46 as provided in subsection 5 of section 160.530.

5. [During the legislative interim between the first regular session of the 47ninety-fifth general assembly through January 29, 2010, of the second regular 48 49session of the ninety-fifth general assembly, the joint committee on education shall study the issue of open enrollment for public school students across school 50district boundary lines in this state. In studying this issue, the joint committee 5152may solicit input and information necessary to fulfill its obligation, including but 53not limited to soliciting input and information from any state department, state agency, school district, political subdivisions of this state, teachers, and the 5455general public. The joint committee shall prepare a final report, together with

its recommendations for any legislative action deemed necessary for submission 56 to the general assembly by December 31, 2009.] By November 1, 2014, the 57committee shall conduct a study of the higher education academic 5859scholarship program, the access Missouri financial assistance program, and the reimbursement portion of the A+ schools program. The study 60 shall include, but not be limited to, eligibility requirements for each 6162 program, acceptance of aid by eligible students, and retention and 63 graduation rates of recipients.

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6. The committee may make reasonable requests for staff assistance from 64 the research and appropriations staffs of the house and senate and the committee 65 66 on legislative research, as well as the department of elementary and secondary education, the department of higher education, the coordinating board for higher 67 68 education, public institutions of higher education, the state tax commission, 69 the department of economic development, all school districts and other political subdivisions of this state, teachers and teacher groups, business and other 7071commercial interests and any other interested persons.

72 7. Members of the committee shall receive no compensation but may be 73 reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses associated with the 74 performance of their official duties.
