Subject to the provisions of Subsection I of 4 this section, a dispenser or retailer, upon payment of an 5 additional fee of one hundred dollars (\$100), may obtain a 6 permit to sell alcoholic beverages in unbroken packages for 7 consumption off the licensed premises on Sundays from noon 8 9 until midnight, and in those years when December 31 falls on a Sunday, from noon on December 31 until 2:00 a.m. of the 10 following day.
