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E. "fund" means the lottery tuition fund;

F. "legacy student" means a full-time resident student who has received for three or more program semesters by the end of fiscal year 2014 the legislative lottery scholarship awarded pursuant to the former provisions of Sections 21-1-4.3, 21-13-10 and 21-16-10.1 NMSA 1978 prior to the enactment of the Legislative Lottery Tuition Scholarship Act;

G. "program semesters" means those semesters for which a legacy or qualified student may receive a tuition scholarship and excludes the first semester of attendance at a public post-secondary educational institution;

 H. "public post-secondary educational institution" means a community college, comprehensive institution, research institution or state educational institution;

I. "qualified student" means a full-time student who graduated from a public or accredited private New Mexico high school or who received a high school equivalency credential while maintaining residency in New Mexico and who:

(1) either:

 (a) immediately upon graduation or receipt of a credential was accepted for entrance to and attended a public post-secondary educational institution; or

 (b) within one hundred twenty days of
 completion of a high school curriculum or receipt of a high school equivalency credential began service in the United
 States armed forces and within one year of completion of honorable service or medical discharge from the service,

attended a public post-secondary educational institution; and (2) successfully completed the first semester at a public post-secondary educational institution with a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale during the first semester of full-time enrollment;

J. "research institution" means the university of New Mexico, New Mexico state university or New Mexico institute of mining and technology;

K. "state educational institution" means an institution of higher education enumerated in Article 12, Section 11 of the constitution of New Mexico and excludes a research institution; and

L. "tuition scholarship" means the scholarship that provides tuition assistance per semester for a qualified student or legacy student attending a public post-secondary educational institution.

SECTION 3. TUITION SCHOLARSHIPS AUTHORIZED--QUALIFIED STUDENTS.--

A. To the extent that funds are made available by the legislature from the fund, the boards of regents or governing bodies of public post-secondary educational institutions shall award tuition scholarships in department-approved amounts to qualified students and legacy students attending their respective public post-secondary educational institutions.

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B. Beginning in fiscal year 2015:

(1) a legacy student is eligible to receive a tuition scholarship until the total number of semesters for which the legislative lottery scholarship was received pursuant to the former provisions of Sections 21-1-4.3,

1 21-13-10 and 21-16-10.1 NMSA 1978 or the Legislative Lottery Tuition Scholarship Act reaches eight; provided that the 2 legacy student maintains residency in New Mexico, maintains a 3 grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale and 4 completes twelve or more credit hours per semester; and 5 (2) a qualified student who is not a legacy 6 student is eligible to receive the tuition scholarship for a 7 maximum of seven program semesters starting in the second 8 program semester, and in an amount determined pursuant to the 9 provisions of Section 4 of the Legislative Lottery Tuition 10 Scholarship Act. 11 C. Except as otherwise provided in this section, a 12 tuition scholarship may be awarded to a qualified student 13 who: 14 (1) maintains residency in New Mexico; 15 (2) maintains a grade point average of 2.5 16 or higher on a 4.0 scale; and 17 (3) completes: 18 (a) for a student attending a four-year 19 public post-secondary educational institution, fifteen or 20 more credit hours per semester; and (b) for a student attending a two-year 21 public post-secondary educational institution, twelve or more 22 credit hours per semester. 23 D. For students with disabilities who may require 24 accommodations, the department, in consultation with the 25 student and the office at the public post-secondary educational institution that serves students with disabilities, shall review both the definition of "full time" SFC/SB 347 and the maximum number of consecutive semesters of Page 4

1 eligibility and adjust either or both as deemed reasonable and appropriate, based on the student's disability needs. In 2 no case, however, shall "full time" mean fewer than six 3 credit hours per semester, and in no case shall eligibility 4 extend beyond fourteen consecutive semesters. 5 SECTION 4. TUITION SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT--FUND.--6 A. Prior to June 1 of each year, based on the 7 amount appropriated by the legislature from the fund and on 8 the projected enrollment at all public post-secondary 9 educational institutions, the department shall: 10 (1) determine the total amount of money 11 available for all tuition scholarships for qualified 12 students; 13 (2) determine the uniform percentage by 14 which to calculate tuition scholarships for qualified 15 students attending any public post-secondary educational 16 institution; and 17 (3) notify all public post-secondary 18 educational institutions of the determinations made pursuant 19 to Paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subsection. 20 Β. In determining distribution and award amounts for the tuition scholarship program, the department shall: 21 (1) maintain the minimum fund balance 22 pursuant to Section 5 of the Legislative Lottery Tuition 23 Scholarship Act; 24 distribute to all public post-secondary (2) 25 educational institutions an amount not to exceed the remaining balance in the fund; and subject to the provisions of Paragraphs (3) (1) and (2) of this subsection, distribute to each public

1 post-secondary educational institution an amount based on: (a) the projected enrollment at each 2 comprehensive institution, research institution and state 3 educational institution of qualified students in their second 4 through eighth program semesters, including qualified 5 students in their fifth through eighth program semesters who 6 transferred from community colleges; 7 (b) the projected enrollment at each 8 community college of qualified students in their second 9 through fourth program semesters; and 10 a uniform percentage of the average (C) 11 of in-state tuition costs charged by: 1) research 12 institutions for each research institution; 2) comprehensive 13 institutions for each comprehensive institution; and 3) 14 community colleges for each community college. 15 SECTION 5. Section 6-24-23 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995, 16 Chapter 155, Section 23, as amended) is recompiled in the 17 Legislative Lottery Tuition Scholarship Act and is amended to 18 read: 19 "LOTTERY TUITION FUND CREATED--PURPOSE.--20 Α. The "lottery tuition fund" is created in the state treasury. The fund shall be administered by the 21 department. Earnings from investment of the fund shall 22 accrue to the credit of the fund. The fund shall maintain an 23 annual average balance of two million dollars (\$2,000,000), 24 and any balance in the fund at the end of any fiscal year 25 shall remain in the fund for appropriation by the legislature as provided in this section.

B. Money in the fund shall be appropriated by the legislature to the department for distribution to New

1 Mexico's public post-secondary educational institutions to provide tuition assistance for qualified students and legacy 2 students as provided in the Legislative Lottery Tuition 3 Scholarship Act." 4 SECTION 6. DEPARTMENT RULEMAKING AND REPORTING.--5 A. The department shall promulgate rules setting 6 forth explicit criteria in accordance with the Legislative 7 Lottery Tuition Scholarship Act for: 8 student gualification and continuing (1)9 eligibility; and 10 (2) calculating the tuition scholarship 11 award amount pursuant to Section 4 of the Legislative Lottery 12 Tuition Scholarship Act and guidelines for the administration 13 of the tuition scholarship program. 14 The department shall report by November 1 of Β. 15 each year to the legislative finance committee and the 16 department of finance and administration on: 17 (1) the status of the fund; 18 (2) tuition scholarship program 19 participation data aggregated for each public post-secondary 20 educational institution to show: (a) the number of gualified students 21 and the number of legacy students who received tuition 22 scholarships in the prior twelve-month period; 23 (b) the total number of students, 24 including qualified students and legacy students, enrolled in 25 the prior twelve-month period; (c) for each semester, the amount of tuition scholarships funded and the amount of tuition costs that were not offset by the tuition scholarship; and

(d) the number of qualified students and the number of legacy students who graduated with a degree and, for each qualified student, the number of consecutive semesters and nonconsecutive semesters attended prior to graduation; and

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(3) any additional information required or requested by the legislative finance committee or the department of finance and administration.

SECTION 7. Section 7-1-6.40 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1997, Chapter 182, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:

"7-1-6.40. DISTRIBUTION--LOCAL DWI GRANT FUND--MUNICIPALITIES--LOTTERY TUITION FUND.--

A. A distribution pursuant to Section 7-1-6.1 NMSA 1978 shall be made to the local DWI grant fund in an amount equal to forty-one and fifty hundredths percent of the net receipts attributable to the liquor excise tax.

B. A distribution pursuant to Section 7-1-6.1 NMSA 1978 of twenty thousand seven hundred fifty dollars (\$20,750) monthly from the net receipts attributable to the liquor excise tax shall be made to a municipality that is located in a class A county and that has a population according to the most recent federal decennial census of more than thirty thousand but less than sixty thousand. The distribution pursuant to this subsection shall be used by the municipality only for the provision of alcohol treatment and rehabilitation services for street inebriates.

C. From July 1, 2015 to July 1, 2017, a distribution pursuant to Section 7-1-6.1 NMSA 1978 of thirty-nine percent of the net receipts attributable to the liquor excise tax shall be made to the lottery tuition fund." Page 8

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SECTION 8. Section 21-13-10 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1963, Chapter 17, Section 9, as amended) is amended to read:

"21-13-10. BOARD DUTIES.--

A. It is the duty of the community college board to determine financial and educational policies of the community college. The community college board shall provide for the management of the community college and execution of these policies by selecting a competent president for the community college, and, upon the president's recommendation, the board shall employ other administrative personnel, instructional staff or other personnel as may be needed for the operation, maintenance and administration of the community college.

B. The community college board shall have the power to fix tuition and fee rates for resident and nonresident students of the community college district, to accept gifts, to accept federal aid, to purchase, hold, sell and rent property and equipment and to promote the general welfare of the institution for the best interest of educational service to the people of the community college district."

SECTION 9. APPROPRIATION.--Eleven million dollars (\$11,000,000) is appropriated from the student financial aid fund of the higher education department to the lottery tuition fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2014 and subsequent fiscal years to supplement the lottery tuition fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert.

SECTION 10. REPEAL.--Sections 21-1-4.3, 21-1-4.4 and 21-16-10.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1996, Chapter 71, Sections
