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AN ACT
RELATING TO STATE GOVERNMENT; ENACTING THE ONE-STOP BUSINESS
PORTAL ACT; PROVIDING FOR THE DEVELOPMENT, OPERATION AND
MAINTENANCE OF A WEB-BASED PORTAL FOR CERTAIN BUSINESS
TRANSACTIONS WITH THE STATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.--This act may be cited as the
"One-Stop Business Portal Act".

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the One-Stop
Business Portal Act:

A. "authorized representative" means a person
authorized by a business to use the one-stop business portal
to complete business transactions with state agencies on
behalf of the business;

B. "department" means the department of
information technology; and

C. "state agency" means the New Mexico state
government or any department, division, institution, board,
bureau, commission or committee of state government and
includes any office or officer of any of the above.

SECTION 3. ONE-STOP BUSINESS PORTAL--DUTIES.--

A. The department shall develop, operate and
maintain a centralized web site that is free, user-friendly,
searchable and accessible to the public that shall provide
authorized representatives of businesses with access or the
ability to electronically conduct certain business
transactions with state agencies and that shall be known as
the "one-stop business portal".

B. No later than January 1, 2017, the department

1 shall provide the framework and define the information
2 exchange process necessary for the one-stop business portal.

3 C. No later than July 1, 2017, the one-stop
4 business portal shall be available for public access and use
5 and shall include the information and capabilities required
6 by Subsection D of this section.

7 D. The one-stop business portal shall provide
8 authorized representatives with a single point of entry for
9 conducting certain business transactions with state agencies
10 and shall facilitate or provide the capability to:

11 (1) access taxation information, including
12 filing and renewal deadlines;

13 (2) make taxation filings and payments;

14 (3) access workers' compensation
15 information, including requirements and deadlines;

16 (4) access information related to business
17 licensing requirements and associated filing and renewal
18 deadlines;

19 (5) complete and submit applications for
20 licenses, registrations and permits that are issued by state
21 agencies and that are required for the transaction of
22 business in New Mexico;

23 (6) complete and file documents that state
24 agencies require for the transaction of business in
25 New Mexico;

(7) make payments, including payments for
application fees, license fees, registration fees, permit
fees, filing fees and payments made pursuant to the Workers'
Compensation Act that must be paid to state agencies;

(8) provide electronic communications with

1 customer service representatives during regular business
2 hours regarding the use of the one-stop business portal and
3 the services offered through the one-stop business portal;
4 and

5 (9) access the sunshine portal.

6 E. The department and state agencies shall share
7 information received pursuant to or required for the
8 operation or function of the one-stop business portal only
9 for the purpose of implementing the provisions of the
10 One-Stop Business Portal Act or rules promulgated by a state
11 agency pursuant to that act.

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12 SECTION 4. RULES PROMULGATION--COMPLIANCE REQUIRED.--

13 A. Pursuant to the State Rules Act, the department
14 shall promulgate rules necessary to support the framework,
15 information exchange process and maintenance of the one-stop
16 business portal pursuant to the One-Stop Business Portal Act.

17 B. Pursuant to the State Rules Act, the secretary
18 of state, the taxation and revenue department, the workforce
19 solutions department, the regulation and licensing department
20 and the workers' compensation administration may promulgate
21 rules to carry out the provisions of the One-Stop Business
22 Portal Act.
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
