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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 57 O.S. 2021, Section 38, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 38. The Department of Corrections shall reimburse any
16	county which is required to retain an inmate pursuant to subsection
17	E of Section 37 of this title in an amount not to exceed Twenty-
18	seven Dollars (\$27.00) <u>Thirty-two Dollars (\$32.00)</u> per day for each
19	inmate during such period of retention, unless the actual daily cost
20	as determined by the Department of Corrections Daily Rate as defined
21	in this section, exceeds Twenty-seven Dollars (\$27.00) <u>Thirty-two</u>
22	Dollars (\$32.00). If the actual daily cost as determined by the
23	Department of Corrections Daily Rate exceeds Twenty-seven Dollars
24	(\$27.00) Thirty-two Dollars (\$32.00), the county shall notify the

1 Department of Corrections of the actual daily cost no later than September 30. If the county's actual daily cost is accepted by the 2 Department that shall be the reimbursement rate for the county 3 4 beginning the next fiscal year. If the Department rejects the 5 county's actual daily cost application, then the actual daily cost reimbursement shall be determined by the State Auditor and shall be 6 7 imposed beginning the next fiscal year. Provided, however, the amounts described in this section shall be subject to an annual 8 9 three percent (3%) increase to adjust for inflation. The Department 10 shall distribute the reimbursement on a monthly basis upon receipt 11 and approval of a billing statement from the county. The county 12 shall use the reimbursement to defray expenses of equipping and 13 maintaining the jail and payment of personnel. The provisions in 14 this act shall be implemented by the Department to allow sufficient 15 time for application to FY-2019. The Department of Corrections 16 shall reimburse the county for the emergency medical care for 17 physical injury or illness of the inmate retained under this act if 18 the injury or illness is directly related to the incarceration and 19 the county is required by law to provide such care for inmates in 20 the jail. The Department shall not pay fees for medical care in 21 excess of the rates established for Medicaid providers. The state 22 shall not be liable for medical charges in excess of the Medicaid 23 scheduled rate. The Director may accept any inmate required to have 24 extended medical care upon application of the county.
