House Bill 4072

Sponsored by Representative ANDERSEN, Senator PATTERSON, Representative MANNIX; Representatives EVANS, GAMBA (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act would make state agencies pay a fee to Salem for the fire, police and emergency medical services that the city provides based on the agencies' use of state-owned land in the city. The Act would let other cities opt in to the fee program. (Flesch Readability Score: 62.1). Requires the Oregon Department of Administrative Services to pay a fee to the City of Salem

Requires the Oregon Department of Administrative Services to pay a fee to the City of Salem for the share of the city's budget for fire, police and emergency medical services provided to state agencies. Authorizes the department to recoup the payment from state agencies according to their use of state-owned land in the city. Authorizes other cities to opt in to the fee program.

(a) "Emergency medical services" has the meaning given that term in ORS 682.400.

(d) "Subject state-owned land" means land owned by the State of Oregon, other than
 highways owned by the Department of Transportation.

(2)(a) On or before April 15 of each year, the Oregon Department of Administrative Ser vices shall provide to the governing body of the City of Salem a report showing the number
 of acres of subject state-owned land situated within the city as of January 1 of the current
 calendar year.

17(b) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services may consult with the Department18of State Lands and the State Parks and Recreation Department when compiling the report

(3)(a) As soon as practicable after receipt of the report, the governing body shall perform
 the following computations:

(A) Subtract from the total number of acres of land within the city boundaries the total
 number of acres of subject state-owned land within the city boundaries.

(B) Divide the total number of acres of subject state-owned land within the city bounda ries by the difference determined under subparagraph (A) of this paragraph.

(1) Upon request, the Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall 24 provide to the governing body of any city in this state other than the City of Salem that 25wishes to introduce within its boundaries the fee program established under sections 1 to 4 2627of this 2024 Act the information necessary for the governing body to make the computations required under section 1 (3) of this 2024 Act. 28(2)(a) The governing body of a city may adopt an ordinance or resolution under which the 2930 fee program shall apply to subject state-owned land situated within the boundaries of the city 31 on the same terms as set forth in section 1 of this 2024 Act for the City of Salem. (b) An ordinance or resolution adopted pursuant to this section shall not become opera-32tive before the next succeeding September 1 of an odd-numbered year that occurs not less 33 34 than 60 days following the effective date of the ordinance or resolution. (c) As soon as practicable after adoption, the governing body shall provide the depart-35 ment with a copy of the ordinance or resolution. 36 37 SECTION 3. (1) The Governmental Services Revolving Fund is established in the State 38 Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund. Interest earned by the Governmental Services Revolving Fund shall be credited to the fund. 39 (2) Moneys in the Governmental Services Revolving Fund shall consist of: 40 (a) Amounts appropriated or otherwise transferred or credited to the fund by the Legis-41 lative Assembly; 42(b) Amounts received from state agencies under section 1 (5) of this 2024 Act; 43 (c) Interest and other earnings received on moneys in the fund; and 44

1 transferred, donated or otherwise credited to the fund.

(3) Moneys in the Governmental Services Revolving Fund are continuously appropriated
to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services for the purposes of sections 1 to 4 of
this 2024 Act.

5 (4) Moneys in the Governmental Services Revolving Fund at the end of a biennium shall 6 be retained in the fund and used for the purposes set forth in subsection (3) of this section.

7 <u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) On or before September 15 of each year, the Oregon Department of Ad-8 ministrative Services shall submit, in the manner provided under ORS 192.245, a report to 9 the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly relating to revenue that sets forth in 10 detail the cumulative experience of the fee program established under sections 1 to 4 of this 11 2024 Act.

(2) The department shall provide to the League of Oregon Cities a copy of the report
 submitted under this section to be made available upon request to the governing body of any
 city in this state.

15SECTION 5. There is appropriated to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services,16for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$10,000,000 for

17 the purpose of carrying out the provisions of sections 1 to 4 of this 2024 Act.
