Amending Title 44 (Law and Justice) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in other officers and officials, providing for law enforcement practices and policy; conferring powers and imposing duties on the Attorney General.
The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. Title 44 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

11	"Law enforcement partner." A law enforcement officer
12	assigned to serve in the line of duty with a fellow law

21	(a) Law enforcement partners requiredAll on-duty law
22	enforcement officers must be assigned and be accompanied by a
23	fellow law enforcement officer while on duty in a designated
24	critical crime area.
25	(b) Critical crime area designationThe Attorney General
26	shall have the authority to identify, define and designate
27	critical crime areas. Law enforcement agencies may petition the
28	Attorney General for temporary critical crime area designation
29	if the area poses a substantial threat to law enforcement
30	officers on duty in that area.

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1	(c) Petition to Attorney GeneralThe Attorney General
2	shall produce a form for petitions under subsection (b) and make
3	the form accessible on the publicly accessible Internet
4	website of the Office of Attorney General. The following
5	applies:
6	(1) The Attorney General must respond to a
7	petition within 30 days of receipt of the petition.
8	(2) Petitions that are rejected shall be returned to the
9	sender with the reason for the rejection.
10	(3) Law enforcement agencies may resubmit a rejected
11	petition after 30 days.
12	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
