AN ACT

- Amending the act of August 15, 1961 (P.L.987, No.442), entitled
- "An act relating to public works contracts; providing for 2
- prevailing wages; imposing duties upon the Secretary of Labor
- and Industry; providing remedies, penalties and repealing existing laws," further providing for definitions; and providing for duties of department.

- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows: 8
- 9 Section 1. Section 2 of the act of August 15, 1961 (P.L.987,
- 10 No.442), known as the Pennsylvania Prevailing Wage Act, amended
- 11 August 9, 1963 (P.L.653, No.342), is amended to read:
- Section 2. Definitions. -- As used in this act--12
- 13 "Advisory Board" means the board created by section 2.1 of
- 14 this act.
- 15 "Appeals Board" means the board created by section 2.2 of
- 16 this act.
- 17 "Department" means Department of Labor and Industry of [(1)]
- the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. 18
- "Federal occupational classifications" means the Occupational 19

- 1 Outlook Handbook of the Federal Bureau of Labor Statistics,
- 2 published under 40 U.S.C § 3142(b) (relating to rate of wages
- 3 for laborers and mechanics).
- 4 [(2)] "Locality" means any political subdivision, or
- 5 combination of the same, within the county in which the public
- 6 work is to be performed. When no workmen for which a prevailing
- 7 minimum wage is to be determined hereunder are employed in the
- 8 locality, the locality may be extended to include adjoining
- 9 political subdivisions where such workmen are employed in those
- 10 crafts or trades for which there are no workmen employed in the
- 11 locality as otherwise herein defined.
- [(3)] "Maintenance work" means the repair of existing
- 13 facilities when the size, type or extent of such facilities is
- 14 not thereby changed or increased.
- 15 [(4)] "Public body" means the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania,
- 16 any of its political subdivisions, any authority created by the
- 17 General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and any
- 18 instrumentality or agency of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- [(5)] "Public work" means construction, reconstruction,
- 20 demolition, alteration and/or repair work other than maintenance
- 21 work, done under contract and paid for in whole or in part out
- 22 of the funds of a public body where the estimated cost of the
- 23 total project is in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars
- 24 (\$25,000), but shall not include work performed under a
- 25 rehabilitation or manpower training program.
- 26 [(6)] "Secretary" means the Secretary of Labor and Industry
- 27 or his duly authorized deputy or representative.
- [(7)] "Workman" includes laborer, mechanic, skilled and
- 29 semi-skilled laborer and apprentices employed by any contractor
- 30 or subcontractor and engaged in the performance of services

- 1 directly upon the public work project, regardless of whether
- 2 their work becomes a component part thereof, but does not
- 3 include material suppliers or their employes who do not perform
- 4 services at the job site.
- 5 [(8)] "Work performed under a rehabilitation program," means
- 6 work arranged by and at a State institution primarily for
- 7 teaching and upgrading the skills and employment opportunities
- 8 of the inmates of such institutions.
- 9 [(9) "Advisory Board" means the board created by section 2.1
- 10 of this act.
- 11 (10) "Appeals Board" means the board created by section 2.2
- 12 of this act.
- 13 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 14 Section 7.1. Duties of Department.--(a) The department
- 15 <u>shall develop or adopt a complete listing of worker</u>
- 16 classifications and their respective definitions, and shall make
- 17 the listings available to the public in a conspicuous location
- 18 on the department's Internet website. The listing shall, at all
- 19 times, be available for public viewing, and shall be maintained
- 20 on a Statewide basis for each worker classification. In
- 21 developing the list, the department may consider the following
- 22 <u>sources:</u>
- 23 (1) collective bargaining agreements;
- 24 (2) Federal occupational classifications;
- 25 <u>(3) input from the advisory board;</u>
- 26 (4) opinions of representatives from organized labor and the
- 27 opinions of contractors and contractor associations as they
- 28 relate to the custom and usage applicable to the construction
- 29 industry in this Commonwealth; and
- 30 (5) any other information that the department deems

- 1 pertinent.
- 2 The definitions for each classification in this subsection shall
- 3 <u>be uniform throughout this Commonwealth.</u>
- 4 (b) Worker classifications as defined by the department at
- 5 the time of the beginning of a project shall be used throughout
- 6 completion of that project, and shall be controlling for
- 7 purposes of any dispute. For purposes of this subsection, the
- 8 beginning of a project shall be deemed to be the earlier of the
- 9 acceptance of bids or offers or the execution of a contract.
- 10 (c) The department shall publish the complete listing of
- 11 worker classifications and their respective definitions, as
- 12 required in subsection (a) within one hundred eighty days after
- 13 the effective date of this section, provided that after the
- 14 <u>initial work descriptions are published</u>, the department may
- 15 change the descriptions from time to time in accordance with the
- 16 criteria in subsection (a).
- 17 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
