- Amending Title 74 (Transportation) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for Public Transit Security 2 Grant Program; establishing the Public Transit Security Grant 3 Program Fund; and imposing duties on the Department of 4 Transportation. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: 8 Section 1. - 1 § 1201. Definitions.
- 2 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 3 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 4 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 5 "Department." The Department of Transportation of the
- 6 <u>Commonwealth</u>.
- 7 "Eligible applicant." Any of the following:
- 8 (1) The governing body of a municipality or an
- 9 <u>instrumentality of a municipality.</u>
- 10 (2) A Commonwealth agency or instrumentality.
- 11 (3) A local or regional public transit authority.
- 12 (4) An association representing public transit
- 13 providers.
- 14 (5) An association representing public transit
- 15 employees.
- 16 "Fund." The Public Transit Security Grant Program Fund
- 17 established under section 1203 (relating to Public Transit
- 18 <u>Security Grant Program Fund</u>).
- 19 "Municipality." A county, city, borough, incorporated town
- 20 or township or home rule, optional plan or optional charter
- 21 municipality, any other general purpose unit of government
- 22 established by the General Assembly, a municipal authority and
- 23 any entity formed under 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 23 Subch. A (relating to
- 24 intergovernmental cooperation).
- 25 "Program." The Public Transit Security Grant Program
- 26 established under section 1202 (relating to grant program).
- 27 "Program grant." A grant awarded under the program.
- 28 § 1202. Grant program.
- 29 <u>(a) Establishment.--The Public Transit Security Grant</u>
- 30 Program is established as a competitive grant program within the

- 1 <u>department</u>.
- 2 (b) Purpose. -- The purpose of the program is to award grants
- 3 to eligible applicants for the prevention, reduction or
- 4 <u>mitigation of the effects of crime relating to public transit</u>
- 5 operations or for the improvement of public transit employee
- 6 <u>safety.</u>
- 7 (c) Administration. -- The department shall administer the
- 8 program.
- 9 (d) Public notice. -- The department shall provide information
- 10 regarding the availability and award of program grant money on
- 11 the department's publicly accessible Internet website.
- 12 § 1203. Public Transit Security Grant Program Fund.
- 13 <u>(a) Establishment.--The Public Transit Security Grant</u>
- 14 Program Fund is established in the State Treasury. The fund
- 15 shall be used for the purpose of awarding grants under this
- 16 chapter.
- 17 (b) Continuing appropriation. -- All money deposited into the
- 18 fund and interest earned on the money in the fund is
- 19 appropriated to the department on a continuing basis to award
- 20 grants under this chapter.
- 21 § 1204. Applications.
- 22 (a) Forms. -- The department shall develop annual grant
- 23 application forms for an eligible applicant to apply for a
- 24 program grant. At a minimum, the forms shall contain the
- 25 following information:
- 26 (1) The name, address and contact information of the
- 27 applicant.
- 28 (2) The amount of program grant money requested.
- 29 (3) The proposed use for the requested program grant
- 30 money.

- 1 (4) If applicable, a detailed maintenance plan for any
- 2 equipment used or installed with money from the program.
- 3 (5) Any other information that the department deems
- 4 <u>necessary and appropriate.</u>
- 5 (b) Application period. -- Beginning no later than 180 days
- 6 after the effective date of this subsection, the department
- 7 <u>shall begin accepting and processing applications. For all</u>
- 8 <u>subsequent years</u>, the department shall establish an application
- 9 period during which applications for grants under this chapter
- 10 are accepted.
- 11 § 1205. Award of program grants.
- 12 (a) Review.--After review of the information provided under
- 13 <u>each applicant's submitted application form, the department</u>
- 14 shall determine whether to award a program grant to the
- 15 applicant and, if so, the amount of the program grant.
- 16 (b) Allocation. -- The department shall determine the
- 17 allocation limit for program grant awards, which may not be in
- 18 excess of the amount in the fund.
- 19 (c) Competitive nature of awards.--Program grants shall be
- 20 <u>awarded on a competitive basis to eliqible applicants. In</u>
- 21 awarding program grants, the department shall:
- 22 (1) Give preference to applicants whose program grant
- 23 <u>proposals demonstrate the greatest likelihood of preventing</u>,
- 24 reducing or mitigating the effects of crime relating to
- 25 public transit operations or of improving the safety of
- 26 public transit employees.
- 27 (2) Consider the scope of the applicant's proposal and
- the applicant's demonstrated need for additional resources to
- 29 <u>effectively prevent or reduce crime relating to public</u>
- transit operations or improve the safety of public transit

- 1 <u>employees.</u>
- 2 (d) Time periods.--
- 3 (1) The department shall approve or deny an application
- 4 <u>no later than 60 days after the receipt of the application.</u>
- 5 (2) If the department fails to approve or deny an
- 6 application within 60 days after the receipt of the
- 7 application, the application shall be deemed denied.
- 8 (e) Notice.--
- 9 <u>(1) The department shall provide written notice to the</u>
- applicant of the award or denial of the program grant.
- 11 (2) The notice under paragraph (1) shall include:
- (i) If awarded, the amount of the program grant and
- any conditions or restrictions on the use of the program
- 14 <u>grant money.</u>
- 15 (ii) If denied in full or in part, the reasons for
- the full or partial denial.
- 17 § 1206. Reports.
- No less than once every three years, the department shall
- 19 prepare and submit a report to the General Assembly on safety
- 20 and security event data relating to public transit funded by
- 21 program grants.
- 22 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
