AN ACT

Amending Title 62 (Procurement) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1 Statutes, in general provisions relating to general 2 procurement provisions, providing for preference for bid or 3 proposal. 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. Title 62 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 8 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: § 3103. Preference for bid or proposal. 10 (a) Authorization. -- Notwithstanding any other law, in the 11 case of competitive sealed bidding or competitive sealed 12 proposals based on price factors, a government agency or school entity authorized to enter a contract for procurement shall: 13 14 (1) subtract 2% from the bid or proposal of a person 15 submitting the bid or proposal if the procurement that is the 16 subject of the bid or proposal involves American-made 17 supplies, services or construction; and

(2) award the contract on the basis of the revised bid

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- or proposal.
- 2 (b) Documentation. -- A government agency or school entity
- 3 shall require documentation to confirm that a person qualifies
- 4 for the 2% preference described under subsection (a).
- 5 (c) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 6 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 7 <u>subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 8 <u>"American-made supplies, services or construction."</u>
- 9 Supplies, services or construction of which at least 75% of the
- 10 costs for the materials, equipment, products or processes
- 11 <u>involved with the supplies</u>, services or construction, are
- 12 derived from the United States.
- 13 "Contract." A written agreement, regardless of what it may
- 14 be called, for the procurement or disposal of supplies, services
- 15 or construction.
- 16 "Person." An individual, organization, sole proprietorship,
- 17 association, corporation, partnership, joint venture, limited
- 18 partnership, limited liability partnership, limited liability
- 19 company or other entity or business association that is capable
- 20 of submitting a bid or proposal to a government agency.
- 21 "Procurement." As follows:
- 22 (1) Buying, purchasing, renting, leasing, licensing or
- otherwise acquiring supplies, services or construction.
- 24 (2) The term includes all functions that pertain to the
- 25 obtaining of any supply, service or construction, including
- description of requirements, selection and solicitation of
- 27 <u>sources, preparation and award of contract and all phases of</u>
- 28 contract administration.
- 29 "School entity." Any of the following:
- 30 (1) A school district of any class.

- 1 (2) A public school or private school.
- 2 (3) A nonpublic school wherein a resident of this
- 3 <u>Commonwealth may legally fulfill the compulsory school</u>
- 4 <u>attendance requirements under the act of March 10, 1949</u>
- 5 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, and
- 6 that meets the requirements of 42 U.S.C. Ch. 21 Subch. V
- 7 <u>(relating to federally assisted programs).</u>
- 8 (4) An intermediate unit.
- 9 <u>(5) A joint school.</u>
- 10 (6) An area career and technical school, as described in
- section 1841 of the Public School Code of 1949.
- 12 <u>(7) A charter school, cyber charter school or regional</u>
- 13 <u>charter school, as those terms are defined in section 1703-A</u>
- of the Public School Code of 1949.
- 15 (8) A State-related institution.
- 16 "United States." The United States of America, including all
- 17 territory, continental or insular, subject to the jurisdiction
- 18 of the United States.
- 19 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
