AN ACT

- Requiring mass transit authorities to file with the Department
- of Transportation and implement an annual plan for natural 2
- gas conversion of buses; and imposing powers and duties on the Department of Transportation.

- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. Short title. 7
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Better Use of
- Specie Act.
- Section 2. Definitions. 10
- The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 11
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 14 "Bus." A motor vehicle designed for carrying 15 or more
- 15 passengers, exclusive of the driver, and used for the
- 16 transportation of persons for compensation.
- 17 "Department." The Department of Transportation of the
- Commonwealth. 18
- 19 "Mass transit authority." An operator of regularly scheduled

- 1 transportation that is available to the general public and is
- 2 provided according to published schedules along designated
- 3 published routes with specified stopping points for taking on
- 4 and discharging of passengers. The term does not include
- 5 exclusive ride taxi services, charter or sightseeing services,
- 6 nonpublic transportation or school bus or limousine services.
- 7 "Natural gas." Gas issued from the Earth's crust through
- 8 natural openings or bored wells and that is typically a
- 9 combustible mixture of methane and other hydrocarbons used
- 10 chiefly as a fuel and raw material. The term includes the
- 11 compressed form and liquefied form of natural gas.
- 12 Section 3. Annual mass transit authority plan for natural gas
- 13 conversion.
- 14 (a) Annual plan. -- Through an annual plan, each mass transit
- 15 authority shall establish goals and objectives, including
- 16 efforts to reach 100% natural gas conversion of its bus fleet.
- 17 The plan shall be developed to promote policies and develop
- 18 mechanisms for newly converting 10% of the bus fleet annually to
- 19 natural gas.
- 20 (b) Submission.--Not later than May 1 of each year, the mass
- 21 transit authority shall submit to the department a plan under
- 22 this section for the ensuing year.
- 23 (c) Contents of plan. -- The plan under this section shall
- 24 include all of the following information:
- 25 (1) A summary of the actions the mass transit authority
- 26 will take to convert 10% of its bus fleet to natural gas
- 27 until all of its bus fleet is converted to natural gas. The
- summary shall lay out the sequence of actions required for
- 29 conversion of the bus fleet to natural gas and shall organize
- 30 the actions into immediate, mid-term and long-term sequences.

- 1 (2) The amount of Federal, State and local funds
- 2 received by the mass transit authority.
- 3 (3) Projections of operating and capital costs and
- 4 savings over a ten-year period.
- 5 (d) Implementation. -- One year from the date of the filing of
- 6 the first annual plan with the department, a mass transit
- 7 authority shall begin implementation of that plan.
- 8 Section 4. Department review.
- 9 (a) Compliance. -- Within 90 days after receipt of an annual
- 10 plan, the department shall determine whether it complies with
- 11 this act. If the plan is found to be in compliance with this
- 12 act, the department shall notify the applicant of the finding in
- 13 writing. If the plan is found to not be in compliance with this
- 14 act, the department shall notify the applicant in writing of the
- 15 finding and its reasons for finding the plan to not be in
- 16 compliance with this act.
- 17 (b) Penalty.--If the department finds that a mass transit
- 18 authority is unable to comply with the requirements of this act
- 19 or has failed to implement the annual plan and a waiver has not
- 20 been granted under section 5, the department shall withhold 10%
- 21 of the mass transit authority's total State funding from the
- 22 following year's funding level.
- 23 Section 5. Waiver.
- 24 (a) General rule. -- The department shall grant a waiver to a
- 25 mass transit authority that is unable to meet the requirements
- 26 of this act for any of the following reasons:
- 27 (1) An act of God.
- 28 (2) A lack of physical availability of natural gas to
- the mass transit authority's facility.
- 30 (3) The cost of conversion to natural gas is greater

- 1 than the savings of converting to natural gas.
- 2 (b) Submission. -- A mass transit authority shall apply for a
- 3 waiver on a form approved by the department.
- 4 Section 6. Appeals.
- 5 Any person aggrieved by action of the department under this
- 6 act shall have the right, within 30 days of receipt of notice of
- 7 such action, to appeal to the Environmental Hearing Board.
- 8 Section 7. Enforcement.
- 9 The department shall investigate compliance with and enforce
- 10 the provisions of this act. The department shall have the power
- 11 to promulgate regulations to ensure the proper administration or
- 12 enforcement of this act.
- 13 Section 8. Effective date.
- 14 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
