## AN ACT

- Amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in ownership of property
- and legal title and equitable estate, further providing for
- 4 right to dispose of a decedent's remains.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 305(a) of Title 20 of the Pennsylvania
- 8 Consolidated Statutes is amended and the section is amended by
- 9 adding a subsection to read:
- 10 § 305. Right to dispose of a decedent's remains.
- 11 (a) General rule.--Except as specified in [subsection (a.1)]
- 12 <u>subsections (a.1) and (a.2)</u>, the determination of the final
- 13 disposition of a decedent's remains shall be as set forth in
- 14 this section unless otherwise specifically provided by waiver
- 15 and agreement of the person entitled to make such determination
- 16 under this section, subject to the provisions of a valid will
- 17 executed by the decedent and sections 8611(a) (relating to
- 18 persons who may execute anatomical gift) and 8654(1) (relating
- 19 to requirement of explicit, specific and separate

- 1 authorization).

- 3 (a.2) Exception for preplanned and prepaid funerals.--
- 4 Subject to the provisions of sections 8611(a) and 8654(1), the
- 5 <u>determination of the final disposition of a decedent's remains</u>
- 6 shall be as set forth in this section, except that an individual
- 7 who has a preplanned and prepaid funeral may direct the
- 8 <u>disposition of the individual's own remains by a written</u>
- 9 statement dated and signed by the individual and witnessed by
- 10 two individuals who are 18 years of age or older. If the
- 11 individual chooses cremation as the individual's desired form of
- 12 <u>disposition</u>, a signed authorization by the individual\_
- 13 prearranging for cremation, executed during the prearrangement
- 14 and witnessed by two individuals who are 18 years of age or
- 15 older, shall preempt the written authorization form required by
- 16 a family member under 49 Pa. Code § 13.201(7) (relating to
- 17 professional responsibilities). For the purposes of this
- 18 subsection, the following shall apply:
- 19 <u>(1) An individual who has a preplanned and prepaid</u>
- funeral and the two witnesses shall sign and date the written
- 21 <u>statement required under this subsection.</u>
- 22 (2) A witness may not be an individual who:
- 23 (i) signs the written statement required under this
- 24 <u>subsection on behalf of and at the direction of the</u>
- 25 individual who has a preplanned and prepaid funeral; or
- 26 (ii) has a material interest in the decedent's
- estate.

- 29 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
