21	subsection (b), a] \underline{A} claim for property tax or rent rebate shall
22	be filed with the department on or before [the 30th day of June]
23	December 31 of the year next succeeding the end of the calendar

1	year in which real property taxes or rent was due and payable.
2	[(b) ExceptionA claim filed after the June 30 deadline
3	until December 31 of such calendar year shall be accepted by the
4	secretary as long as funds are available to pay the benefits to
