## AN ACT

- Amending the act of August 9, 1955 (P.L.323, No.130), entitled "An act relating to counties of the first, second class A, 1 2 third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth classes; 3 amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto; relating to imposition of excise taxes by counties, including authorizing imposition of an excise tax on the rental of motor vehicles by counties of the first class; and providing for regional renaissance initiatives," 8 in coroner, further providing for fees for reports. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 11 hereby enacts as follows: 12 Section 1. Section 1252-B of the act of August 9, 1955 13 (P.L.323, No.130), known as The County Code, is amended to read: Section 1252-B. Fees for reports. 14 [The] (a) General rule. -- Except as provided in subsection 15 16 (b), the coroner shall charge and collect a fee of \$500 for an 17 autopsy report, \$100 for a toxicology report, \$100 for an 18 inquisition or coroner's report, \$50 for a cremation or 19 disposition authorization and other fees as may be established
- 21 nongovernmental agencies in order to investigate a claim

from time to time for other reports or documents requested by

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- 1 asserted under a policy of insurance or to determine liability
- 2 for the death of the deceased.
- 3 (b) Fees for next-of-kin of deceased. -- The coroner may
- 4 charge and collect a fee of not more than \$100 for an autopsy
- 5 report, \$50 for a toxicology report and \$50 for an inquisition
- 6 or coroner's report requested by the spouse, child, parent or
- 7 <u>sibling of the deceased</u>.
- 8 (c) Accounting for and use of fees collected. -- The fees
- 9 collected under this section shall be accounted for and paid to
- 10 the county treasurer in accordance with section 1760 and shall
- 11 be used to defray the expenses involved in the county complying
- 12 with the training of coroners or coroner office personnel, as
- 13 may be required or authorized by this or any other act.
- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
