AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, providing for Internet instruction where school is closed due 6 to weather or other emergency. 7 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 11 12 section to read: 13 Section 1505. Internet Instruction Where School is Closed 14 Due to Weather or Other Emergency. -- (a) Notwithstanding section 15 1501, prior to the first day of August of each year, a school entity may submit to the department a plan to require students 16 17 to access and complete classroom lessons posted on the school 18 entity's Internet website in order to make up instructional days during the upcoming school year on which the school entity 19

determines it is necessary to close due to weather or other

- 2 (b) Under a plan submitted to the department under
- 3 <u>subsection (a), the school entity shall:</u>
- 4 (1) Provide for making up any number of days, up to a
- 5 maximum of three (3) days, through Internet instruction.
- 6 (2) Require each classroom teacher in the school entity, not
- 7 <u>later than November 1 of the school year for which the plan is</u>
- 8 <u>submitted</u>, or not later than December 31 for courses that begin
- 9 <u>after January 1 of the school year, to develop a sufficient</u>
- 10 number of lessons for each course taught by the classroom
- 11 teacher during that school year to permit the number of days
- 12 provided for under the plan to be made up by Internet
- 13 <u>instruction</u>. The classroom teacher shall designate the order in
- 14 which the school entity shall post the lessons on the school
- 15 entity's Internet website in the event of a school closure.
- 16 (3) Require each classroom teacher to update or replace the
- 17 lesson plans developed under paragraph (2) to the extent
- 18 possible and necessary to correspond to instructional progress
- 19 during the school year and require the school entity to post the
- 20 updated or replaced lessons on the school entity's Internet
- 21 <u>website</u>.
- 22 (4) Make the lessons designated by the classroom teacher
- 23 under paragraph (2) or (3) available to students on the school
- 24 entity's Internet website as soon as practicable after the
- 25 announcement of a school closure. The school entity shall post a
- 26 lesson for each course that is scheduled to meet during the
- 27 <u>hours of the closure.</u>
- 28 (5) Subject to subsection (e), allow each student two (2)
- 29 weeks to complete each lesson posted on the Internet website for
- 30 the courses in which the student is enrolled. The student's

- 1 classroom teacher shall grade the lesson in the same manner as
- 2 other lessons assigned or conducted by the classroom teacher and
- 3 <u>may award a student an "incomplete" or "failing" grade for</u>
- 4 <u>lessons that are not completed on time.</u>
- 5 (6) Subject to subsection (e), for those students who do not
- 6 have access to a computer and an Internet connection at the
- 7 <u>student's residence</u>, <u>either of the following:</u>
- 8 (i) Allow the student to work on the posted lessons at
- 9 school after school reopens. The student shall be allowed a two
- 10 (2) week period from the date on which school reopens to
- 11 complete the lessons. The student shall be provided access to a
- 12 computer before, during or after the regularly scheduled school
- 13 <u>day</u>.
- 14 (ii) Provide the student with paper lessons that are
- 15 <u>substantially similar to the lessons posted on the school</u>
- 16 entity's Internet website and allow the student a two (2) week
- 17 period from the date on which school reopens to complete each
- 18 paper lesson.
- 19 (7) Obtain written consent to the plan by the employe
- 20 organization representing the school entity's classroom
- 21 teachers.
- 22 (c) The department shall review plans provided by school
- 23 entities under subsection (b) and shall grant written approval
- 24 of any plan which satisfies the requirements of this section
- 25 within thirty (30) days of submission of the plan to the
- 26 <u>department</u>.
- 27 (d) Days for which a school entity provides Internet
- 28 instruction pursuant to a plan approved by the department under
- 29 subsection (c) shall be considered instructional days for
- 30 purposes of section 1501.

- 1 (e) Nothing in this section or any plan approved by the
- 2 <u>department under this section shall conflict with:</u>
- 3 (1) Federal or State law regarding the protections provided
- 4 to a student with a disability for receiving education in the
- 5 least restrictive environment.
- 6 (2) The legal authority of an individualized education
- 7 program team to make appropriate program and placement decisions
- 8 for a student with a disability in accordance with the student's
- 9 <u>individualized education program.</u>
- 10 (f) As used in this section, the following terms shall have
- 11 the meanings given to them in this subsection unless the context
- 12 <u>clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 13 <u>"Classroom teacher." A professional employe, temporary</u>
- 14 professional employe or substitute as such terms are defined in
- 15 section 1101 who provides direct instruction to students related
- 16 to a specific subject or grade level.
- 17 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 18 Commonwealth.
- "Internet instruction." Lessons posted on a school entity's
- 20 Internet website which students are required to access and
- 21 complete in order to make up instructional days on which the
- 22 school entity is closed due to weather or other emergency.
- 23 "School entity." A school district, joint school district,
- 24 intermediate unit, area vocational-technical school, charter
- 25 school or regional charter school. The term shall not include a
- 26 cyber charter school.
- 27 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
