AN ACT

1 2 3	Establishing the Veterans' Housing Assistance Program; imposing duties on Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency and Department of Military and Veterans Affairs; and making appropriations.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Short title.
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Preventing
8	Veterans' Homelessness Act.
9	Section 2. Definitions.
10	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
11	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
12	context clearly indicates otherwise:
13	"Agency." The Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency.
14	"Costs associated with the rental." The total costs of rent
15	and utilities, per month, for a residential rental unit.
16	"Department." The Department of Military and Veterans
17	Affairs of the Commonwealth.

"Financial assistance." The rental voucher established under
 section 5(a).

3 "Homeless veteran." A veteran identified and determined by 4 the department to be homeless or at imminent risk of becoming 5 homeless according to guidelines established by the department. 6 "Housing ombudsman." An individual designated by the agency 7 to carry out the duties and responsibilities under section 3(c) 8 (1).

9 "Program." The Veterans' Housing Assistance Program10 established under section 3.

11 "Veteran." An individual who served on active duty in the 12 United States Armed Forces, including any of the following:

(1) A reservist or member of the National Guard who was
discharged or released from the service under honorable
conditions.

16 (2) A reservist or member of the National Guard who
 17 completed an initial term of enlistment or qualifying period
 18 of service.

(3) A reservist or member of the National Guard who was
 disabled in the line of duty during training.
 Section 3. Veterans' Housing Assistance Program.

(a) Establishment.--The Veterans' Housing Assistance Program
is established and shall be administered by the agency in
coordination with the department.

25 (b) Duties of department.--The department shall do all of 26 the following:

(1) Implement a program to identify homeless veteransfor purposes of enrolling them in the program.

29 (2) Coordinate with the agency to ensure that homeless
 30 veterans are provided the opportunity to receive assistance

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1 from the agency's housing ombudsman or financial assistance
2 from the agency.

3 (3) Establish guidelines to assist with the4 implementation of this act.

5 (c) Duties of agency.--The agency shall do all of the 6 following:

7 (1) Establish a housing ombudsman or contract with a
8 nonprofit organization to provide housing location,
9 relocation and stabilization services to homeless veterans,
10 including negotiating lease agreements with public agencies
11 or private landlords on behalf of a homeless veteran.

12 (2) Provide or contract with a third party to provide 13 credit counseling services to homeless veterans to resolve 14 personal credit issues that may have resulted in a negative 15 credit report.

16 (3) Award financial assistance to eligible homeless
17 veterans determined to be in need of financial assistance to
18 obtain housing.

19 (4) Establish guidelines to assist with the20 implementation of this act.

21 Section 4. Enrollment.

(a) Procedure.--A veteran may enroll in the program by
filing an application with the department or the agency. A
veteran shall be eligible for enrollment if the veteran meets
all of the following:

(1) Is homeless or at imminent risk of becoming homeless
as defined in departmental guidelines established under
section 3(b).

29 (2) Cannot obtain adequate housing without the30 assistance of the department and the agency.

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1 (b) Conditions.--The department may require an eligible 2 veteran to engage in or complete any of the following activities 3 as a condition of acceptance into the program: Mental health counseling, including treatment and 4 (1)5 recovery support. Substance abuse treatment and recovery support, 6 (2) 7 including counseling, treatment planning, recovery coaching 8 and relapse prevention. 9 (3) Integrated, coordinated treatment for co-occurring 10 disorders. 11 (4) Health education, including referrals for medical 12 and dental care. Services or activities designed to promote self-13 (5) 14 sufficiency, including: 15 (i) Job training. 16 (ii) Assistance in seeking employment. 17 (iii) Job placement services, including job 18 readiness, literacy and skills training. 19 (iv) Credit counseling services and remediation. 20 (v) Benefits advocacy. 21 (vi) Money management. 22 (vii) Parental skills and family support programs. 23 (viii) Other self-help programs deemed necessary by 24 the department. Section 5. Financial assistance. 25 26 Rental voucher. -- The agency may award financial (a) assistance under section 3(c) to a veteran deemed to be in need 27 28 of the assistance based on the veteran's personal finances. 29 Financial assistance shall be awarded to an eligible veteran in the form of a housing rental voucher payable to the lessor named 30

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in a leasing document executed between the veteran and a
 landlord.

3 (b) Amount.--The monthly amount of the rental voucher may 4 not exceed the costs associated with the rental or \$1,000, 5 whichever is less.

6 (c) Term.--Financial assistance shall be awarded to a 7 veteran for the term of the lease executed between the veteran 8 and the lessor or for 12 months from the effective date of the 9 lease, whichever is less.

10 Section 6. Renewal.

A veteran receiving financial assistance under section 5 may seek an extension of the term of the financial assistance by filing an application with the department. In determining whether to extend the term of the financial assistance, the department shall consider the following concerning the veteran:

(1) Employment status.

(2) Personal finances.

18 (3) Compliance with conditions of enrollment placed on19 the veteran under section 4(b).

20 Section 7. Cooperation.

21 The department and the agency may cooperate with the United States Department of Veterans Affairs or local public housing 22 23 authorities to carry out the provisions of this act. At the 24 discretion of the department and the agency, the cooperation may 25 include coordinating the program with an existing Federal 26 program that provides funding for housing for homeless veterans, including the United States Department of Housing and Urban 27 28 Development-Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing Program. 29 Section 8. Appropriations.

30 (a) Agency.--The sum of \$12,500,000 is appropriated from the 20230HB0235PN0196 - 5 -

General Fund to the agency for the period of July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024, for purposes of providing financial assistance to homeless veterans and carrying out the agency's responsibilities under this act. Not more than \$500,000 of the funds appropriated under this section may be used for administrative costs incurred by the agency to carry out this act.

7 (b) Department.--The sum of \$500,000 is appropriated from 8 the General Fund to the department for the period of July 1, 9 2023, to June 30, 2024, for purposes of carrying out the 10 department's responsibilities under this act.

11 Section 9. Effective date.

12 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
