## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in preliminary provisions, providing for county assessments of student performance.

- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 Section 121.2. County assessments of student performance.--
- 13 (a) The State Board, in consultation with the governing bodies
- 14 of school entities located in a county, shall develop a county
- 15 <u>assessment of student performance. A school entity in the county</u>
- 16 shall use the county assessment to evaluate student proficiency
- 17 <u>levels.</u>
- 18 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law or regulation
- 19 to the contrary, student demonstration of proficiency of the
- 20 academic standard measured in a county assessment shall not be a

- 1 requirement of eligibility for high school graduation.
- 2 (c) The requirement under subsection (a) shall be in place
- 3 of and not in addition to a Statewide-administered assessment.
- 4 (d) For the purposes of this section, the following words
- 5 and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 6 <u>subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 7 (1) "County assessment" or "county assessment of student
- 8 performance." A measurement of student performance on a set of
- 9 academic standards in a subject area to determine if the student
- 10 meets certain performance level expectations required to achieve
- 11 proficiency in alignment with Federal or State academic
- 12 <u>standards. The assessment may be established under Federal or</u>
- 13 State law, regulation or department initiative or as part of a
- 14 <u>waiver process regardless of whether it is implemented as a</u>
- 15 requirement of the law, regulation or initiative, voluntarily by
- 16 the Commonwealth or as a condition for participation in a grant
- 17 program. The assessment may be in the form of a national
- 18 standardized assessment, a department-created assessment or an
- 19 <u>assessment developed in conjunction with a consortium.</u>
- 20 Assessment shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
- 21 <u>(i) The Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA)</u>
- 22 test.
- 23 (ii) A Keystone Exam or another test established by the
- 24 State Board to meet the requirements of section 2603-B(d)(10)(i)
- 25 and required under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (Public
- 26 Law 107-110, 115 Stat. 1425) or its successor Federal statute.
- 27 <u>(iii) A test or assessment established by the State Board to</u>
- 28 meet the requirements of section 9401 of the Elementary and
- 29 Secondary Education Act (Public Law 89-10, 20 U.S.C. § 7861)
- 30 flexibility waiver application submitted by the department.

- 1 (iv) A project-based assessment established under 22 Pa.
- 2 <u>Code § 4.51c (relating to project-based assessment).</u>
- 3 (v) A local assessment established under 22 Pa. Code § 4.52
- 4 <u>(relating to local assessment system).</u>
- 5 (2) "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 6 <u>Commonwealth</u>.
- 7 (3) "School entity." A school district, intermediate unit,
- 8 area vocational-technical school, charter school, cyber charter
- 9 <u>school</u>, <u>regional charter school or multiple charter school</u>
- 10 organization.
- 11 (4) "State Board." The State Board of Education of the
- 12 Commonwealth.
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
