AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Pennsylvania Military Community Enhancement 2 Commission; and providing for its powers and duties.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania
- 7 Military Community Enhancement Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Commission." The Pennsylvania Military Community
- 13 Enhancement Commission.
- 14 Section 3. Pennsylvania Military Community Enhancement
- 15 Commission.
- 16 (a) Establishment. -- The Pennsylvania Military Community

- 1 Enhancement Commission is established within the Department of
- 2 Community and Economic Development.
- 3 (b) Members.--The commission shall be composed of the
- 4 following:
- 5 (1) A member appointed by the President pro tempore of
- 6 the Senate.
- 7 (2) A member appointed by the Minority Leader of the
- 8 Senate.
- 9 (3) A member appointed by the Speaker of the House of
- 10 Representatives.
- 11 (4) A member appointed by the Minority Leader of the
- 12 House of Representatives.
- 13 (5) A member appointed by the Governor who has
- 14 experience at the senior level of the military, such as an
- active duty retired three-star or four-star military officer,
- and who is familiar with the operations represented by the
- 17 installations and organizations stationed in this
- 18 Commonwealth. The member shall serve as the chairperson
- during the absence of the member appointed under paragraph
- 20 (8).
- 21 (6) At least two members appointed by the Governor who
- are representatives of the military installations or
- organizations stationed in this Commonwealth and who have
- knowledge of the mission and operations of the installation
- or organization they represent.
- 26 (7) At least two members appointed by the Governor who
- are experts in the field of economic development and who are
- 28 knowledgeable in the missions and operations of the military
- in their respective regions of this Commonwealth.
- 30 (8) An executive director appointed by the Governor who

- is employed by the Department of Community and Economic
- 2 Development.
- 3 (c) Chairperson. -- A chairperson shall be elected by a
- 4 majority of the commission members.
- 5 (d) Compensation. -- Commission members shall not receive
- 6 compensation for their services, but shall receive reimbursement
- 7 for their necessary and proper expenses for attendance at
- 8 meetings.
- 9 Section 4. Commission membership terms.
- 10 (a) Terms.--Commission members shall be appointed for a term
- 11 of two years and serve until their respective successors are
- 12 appointed. A member may be reappointed for additional terms.
- 13 Members appointed by the Governor under section 3(b) shall serve
- 14 at the pleasure of the Governor.
- 15 (b) Vacancy. -- If a vacancy occurs on the commission, a
- 16 successor shall be appointed in the same manner as the
- 17 predecessor.
- 18 (c) Absenteeism.--A commission member who is absent from two
- 19 consecutive meetings of the commission without a reasonable
- 20 excuse as determined by the chairperson shall forfeit membership
- 21 on the commission.
- 22 Section 5. Powers and duties of commission.
- 23 The commission shall have the following powers and duties:
- 24 (1) Closely monitoring the activities at the Federal
- level pertaining to any initiative or proposal that will
- affect, either positively or negatively, any military
- installation or organization and defense-related organization
- in this Commonwealth.
- 29 (2) Establishing a viable and long-term relationship
- 30 with each military installation, organization and defense-

- 1 related organization in this Commonwealth.
- 2 (3) Advising on the expansion of economic development
- 3 opportunities and defense-related industry organizations in
- 4 public or private sectors in this Commonwealth.
- 5 (4) Educating and engaging the stakeholders at the
- 6 Federal, State and local levels and in the public and private
- 7 sectors on the enhancement and preservation of the military
- 8 installations and organizations and defense-related
- 9 organizations in this Commonwealth.
- 10 (5) Advocating at the Federal, State and local levels
- for the enhancement of the military installations and
- organizations and defense-related organizations in this
- 13 Commonwealth in order to fully support our nation's military
- 14 at home and abroad.
- 15 (6) Estimating an annual budget for the commission.
- 16 Section 6. Office of Executive Director.
- 17 The Office of Executive Director is established in the
- 18 commission. The office shall be staffed by the executive
- 19 director appointed under section 3(b)(8), a deputy director and
- 20 a mid-level administrative officer to fulfill the commission's
- 21 purpose and responsibilities. Consultants may be employed as
- 22 deemed necessary by the commission.
- 23 Section 7. Report.
- 24 The commission shall report its activities no less than
- 25 quarterly to the Governor or the Governor's designated
- 26 representative.
- 27 Section 8. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 60 days.
