## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled, as reenacted, "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and 2 malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating 3 and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and 4 restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, 5 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding 6 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 7 8 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing 10 11 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 12 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain 13 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure 14 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 15 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," 16 further providing for Bureau of Consumer Relations. 17 18 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 19 hereby enacts as follows: 20 Section 1. Section 213 of the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, reenacted and amended June 29, 21 2.2 1987 (P.L.32, No.14) and amended April 29, 1994 (P.L.212, 23 No.30), is amended to read: 24 Section 213. [Bureau of] Consumer Relations. -- The board 25 [shall establish a Bureau of Consumer Relations which shall be

responsible for handling all consumer complaints and

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- 1 suggestions. The bureau] shall develop a system-wide program for
- 2 investigating all complaints and suggestions and implementing
- 3 improvements into the State store system. [The management of the
- 4 bureau shall be vested in a director, who shall be assisted by
- 5 such other personnel as the board deems necessary.]
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
