Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in emergency management services, providing for counterterrorism planning, preparedness and 3 response; in Emergency Management Assistance Compact, 4 providing for construction; and making repeals. 1	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter

4	"Commission." The Joint State Government Commission.
_5	"Disaster medical assistance team." A complement of
L 6	individuals organized in accordance with standards developed by
_7	the agency and applicable Federal agencies to provide medical
8 .	service at the scene of disasters and mass casualty incidents.
9	"Disaster mortuary response team." A complement of
20	individuals organized in accordance with standards developed by
21	the agency and applicable Federal agencies to provide mortuary
22	service at the scene of disasters and mass casualty incidents.
23	"FEMA." The Federal Emergency Management Agency.
24	"Letter of agreement." A written agreement between a
25	regional counterterrorism task force and a public, semipublic,
26	private or nonprofit corporation, business, association,
27	partnership, authority, individual or other entity that provides
28	for:
29	(1) Personnel, equipment, supplies, training facilities
30	or other resources either directly to or in support of the

1	task force's specialized regional counterterrorism response
2	team.
3	(2) Workers' compensation and death benefits.
4	(3) Use of county 911 communications centers, county
5	emergency management agencies or the State emergency
6	operations center.
7	(4) Member participation in training exercises, drills
8	and actual activation and deployment.
9	"Municipal" or "municipality." A city, borough, incorporated
10	town, township or home rule municipality of this Commonwealth.
11	"Mutual aid." A county's, municipality's or volunteer
12	service organization's affirmative act of sending its personnel,
13	equipment or resources to the scene of an actual or potential
14	disaster, whether inside or outside the boundaries of this
15	Commonwealth, in response to an official dispatch request from a
16	county 911 communications center, county emergency management
17	agency or the State emergency operations center.
18	"Mutual aid agreement." A written agreement between a
19	regional counterterrorism task force and a county, municipality
20	or volunteer service organization that provides for:
21	(1) The county, municipality or volunteer service
22	organization to provide personnel, equipment or other
23	resources in response to an actual or potential disaster.
24	(2) Workers' compensation and death benefits.
25	(3) Use of county 911 communications centers, county
26	emergency management agencies or the State emergency
27	operations center.
28	(4) Member participation in training exercises, drills
29	and actual activation and deployment.

24	(2) The term includes a disaster medical assistance team
25	and disaster mortuary response team.
26	"Urban search and rescue task force." A multidisciplined
27	complement of individuals organized by the agency in accordance
28	with standards developed by the agency and FEMA to provide
29	emergency response and search and rescue capabilities and
30	resources at the scene of a disaster consistent with NIMS

quidelines. 1 "Volunteer service organization." A volunteer fire company, 2 volunteer ambulance or medical company, volunteer rescue squad or any other volunteer entity organized and chartered or 4 5 incorporated in this Commonwealth or chartered by the Congress of the United States for the primary purpose of providing 6 7 emergency services as defined in section 7102 (relating to 8 definitions). § 7203. Joint State Government Commission study. 10 (a) Duty. The commission shall conduct a comprehensive study and assessment on the need, readiness and state of 11 operations of Pennsylvania Task Force 1 and the Commonwealth's 12 13 urban search and rescue capabilities and identify vulnerabilities, gaps in the system and areas of necessary and 14 15 appropriate improvement. 16 (b) Advisory board. The commission shall establish an 17 advisory board to conduct the study under this section. The board shall consist of the following members or their designee: 18 (1) The Director of PEMA. 19 20 (2) The Adjutant General. (3) The State Fire Commissioner. 21 (4) The Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police. 22 23 (5) The Secretary of Conservation and Natural Resources. (6) The Secretary of Environmental Protection. 24 25 (7) The Secretary of Health. 26 (8) The Secretary of Transportation. (9) The Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Fish and 27 28 Boat Commission. 29 (10) The Commander of the Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol. 30 (11) The FEMA Region 3 Representative.

10	Association of Boroughs.
11	(17) A representative of the executive board of the
12	Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors.
13	(18) A representative of the Municipal League.
14	(19) A representative of the Pennsylvania State
15	Association of Township Commissioners.
16	(20) The President of Pennsylvania Task Force 1.
17	(21) A representative of the Pennsylvania Fire Advisory
18	Board.
19	(22) A representative of the Ambulance Association of
20	Pennsylvania.
21	(23) Three directors of regional task forces, which task
22	forces must be located in western Pennsylvania, central
23	Pennsylvania and eastern Pennsylvania.
24	(24) A representative of the County Commissioners
25	Association of Pennsylvania.
26	(c) Conduct and assessment. The commission shall:
27	(1) Conduct the study by reviewing the following:
28	(i) Strategies developed and utilized by agencies
29	and businesses throughout this Commonwealth for dealing
30	with disaster emergencies under the all hazards

Τ	<u>preparedness standards provided by NIMS.</u>
2	(ii) Security measures and response plans in place
3	for critical emergency management and response for
4	infrastructure such as bridges, roads, power stations,
5	airports, dockyards and other critical infrastructure.
6	(iii) In consultation with PEMA, the overall
7	emergency response system plan for this Commonwealth in
8	accordance with NIMS standards and guidelines.
9	(iv) The level of training required and competency
10	among Pennsylvania Task Force 1 staff, including current
11	operations conducted by Pennsylvania Task Force 1.
12	(v) The current capabilities of Pennsylvania Task
13	Force 1 and the Commonwealth's regional task forces
14	related to extraction from damaged or collapsed
15	structures in this Commonwealth.
16	(vi) The status of protocols and capabilities of
17	emergency medical services care provided by and to task
18	forces for entrapped survivors, task force personnel and
19	others. The assessment shall include canine search
20	capability, readiness and care.
21	(vii) Pennsylvania Task Force 1's reconnaissance
22	capabilities regarding damage assessment, mission
23	<u>readiness and resource needs.</u>
24	(viii) PEMA's protocols and communications
25	capabilities between Pennsylvania Task Force 1, this
26	Commonwealth's current regional task forces and local
27	emergency response personnel, such as fire companies, EMS
28	agencies and State and local law enforcement, as well as
29	Federal, State and local governments regarding their
30	emergency operations.

Τ	(1x) The current protocols, capabilities or needs
2	for hazardous material surveys, extraction and cleanup.
3	(x) Pennsylvania Task Force 1's and this
4	Commonwealth's regional task forces' capabilities
5	regarding structural stabilization as well as shoring and
6	cribbing operations to damaged buildings.
7	(xi) The current protocols and capabilities of
8	Pennsylvania Task Force 1's aquatic and aerial
9	operations.
10	(2) Review, assess, inventory and catalog equipment
11	possessed by Pennsylvania Task Force 1 and each other
12	regional task force in this Commonwealth.
13	(3) Conduct a monetary assessment to identify and
14	quantify the funding impacts of Pennsylvania Task Force 1 and
15	the regional task force system, as well as the funding impact
16	and needs of creating an additional FEMA Level 1 through 4
17	task force in this Commonwealth.
18	(d) Urban search and rescue. The commission shall examine
19	each of the component parts of the urban search and rescue
20	system in this Commonwealth, including Pennsylvania Task Force
21	1, according to the policies and procedures of the National
22	<u>Urban Search and Rescue Response System. The commission shall</u>
23	examine the capability of the current urban search and rescue
24	system in this Commonwealth to meet the challenges that the
25	current system faces.
26	(e) Report and recommendations. In developing a report as
27	required under this section, the commission shall identify gaps
28	in the system and develop recommendations to address the gaps.
29	The information shall include the identification of resources
30	necessary to address gaps and shall include the identification

- 1 of areas or regions in this Commonwealth that lack resources in
- 2 accordance with the policies and procedures of the National
- 3 <u>Urban Search and Rescue Response System.</u>
- 4 <u>(f) Time. The commission shall submit to the General</u>
- 5 Assembly a report of its findings and recommendations by
- 6 November 30, 2024.

- 19 § 7211. Counterterrorism planning, preparedness and response
- 20 program.
- 21 (a) Coordination and consultation. The agency shall
- 22 coordinate and consult with other State agencies, departments
- 23 and offices, including the Office of Homeland Security of the
- 24 Commonwealth, to establish, develop and maintain a
- 25 counterterrorism planning, preparedness and response program to
- 26 promote and protect the health, safety and welfare of emergency
- 27 <u>responders, public officials and the general public from actual</u>
- 28 or potential disasters in this Commonwealth.
- 29 (b) Agency responsibilities. The agency shall:
- 30 (1) Define the necessary components and composition of

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2	regional counterterrorism response teams and the respective
3	regional counterterrorism zones for each, but shall not be
4	responsible for appointing individual members to the regional
5	counterterrorism task forces or the specialized regional
6	<u>counterterrorism response teams.</u>
7	(2) Provide training and technical assistance for
8	counterterrorism planning, preparedness and response.
9	(3) Establish guidelines and policies to coordinate
10	emergency response activities with Federal, State, county and
11	municipal emergency management, health, law enforcement,
12	public safety and other officials and representatives from
13	volunteer service organizations, private business and
14	industry, hospitals and medical care facilities and other
15	entities responsible for the health, safety and welfare of
16	the residents of this Commonwealth. The agency shall consult
17	with representatives of the regional counterterrorism task
18	forces to develop such policies and guidelines necessary to
19	carry out this chapter.
20	(4) Require the regional counterterrorism task forces to
21	prepare counterterrorism emergency response plans or
22	protocols, readiness evaluation reports or other documents
23	deemed necessary by the agency.
24	(5) Provide grants and other funding assistance as
25	required by this chapter.
26	(6) Conduct terrorist incident exercises.
27	(7) Provide technical assistance to regional
28	counterterrorism task forces in developing and entering into
29	mutual aid agreements and letters of agreement.
30	(8) Establish a certification program for specialized

- 1 regional counterterrorism response teams that may include
- 2 standards for the administration, composition, training and
- 3 equipping of the teams.
- 4 § 7212. Regional counterterrorism task forces.
- 5 (a) Establishment. The agency, in coordination with State,
- 6 <u>county and municipal emergency management, health, law</u>
- 7 enforcement, public safety and other officials and
- 8 representatives from volunteer service organizations, private
- 9 business and industry, hospitals and medical care facilities and
- 10 other entities responsible for the health, safety and welfare of
- 11 <u>the residents of this Commonwealth, shall establish regional</u>
- 12 <u>counterterrorism task forces throughout this Commonwealth.</u>
- 13 (b) Response plans. A regional counterterrorism task force
- 14 <u>shall prepare a counterterrorism preparedness and response plan</u>
- 15 in accordance with guidelines developed by the agency. The
- 16 agency shall review and approve each plan in a timely manner,
- 17 but no later than 90 days after its submission to the agency.
- 18 The task force shall review and update the plan on an annual
- 19 basis.
- 20 (c) Meetings. Regional counterterrorism task force meetings
- 21 that are called to discuss sensitive or classified law
- 22 enforcement, terrorist threat assessment or other confidential
- 23 public and private facility safety information shall not be
- 24 deemed a public record subject to disclosure under 65 Pa.C.S.
- 25 Ch. 7 (relating to open meetings).
- 26 <u>§ 7213. Regional counterterrorism response and preparedness.</u>
- 27 <u>(a) Specialized regional counterterrorism response teams. A</u>
- 28 regional counterterrorism task force shall establish specialized
- 29 regional counterterrorism response teams.
- 30 (b) Regional counterterrorism response zones. The agency

1	shall establish primary and secondary regional response zones
2	within this Commonwealth for specialized regional
3	counterterrorism response teams. The regional response zones may
4	consist of multiple counties or portions of several adjoining
5	counties as determined by the agency.
6	(c) Activation and deployment. A specialized regional
7	counterterrorism response team may be activated and deployed by
8	the Governor, the Governor's designee or an official designated
9	by the appropriate regional counterterrorism task force.
_0	§ 7214. Urban search and rescue task forces.
1	(a) Establishment. In addition to any urban search and
.2	rescue task force established by the Federal Government, the
13	agency shall establish urban search and rescue task forces,
4	<u>including:</u>
_5	(1) No more than one urban search and rescue task force
6	that:
_7	(i) is organized by the Commonwealth within each
8 ـ	regional counterterrorism task force; and
9	(ii) provides comprehensive urban search and rescue
20	services to all areas of this Commonwealth as deemed
21	necessary by the agency.
22	(2) At least one urban search and rescue task force
23	that:
24	(i) is organized by the Commonwealth within a
25	regional counterterrorism task force covering a county of
26	the second class; and
27	(ii) no later than January 1, 2026, meets or exceeds
28	the minimum requirements of a Type 3 urban search and
29	rescue task force as designated by FEMA in the NIMS_
30	guidelines, as certified by the agency.

1	(b) Support. The task forces shall also provide
2	professional, logistical, material and other forms of support to
3	regional counterterrorism task forces and specialized regional
4	counterterrorism response teams.
5	(c) Organization An urban search and rescue task force
6	shall be organized in accordance with guidelines developed by
7	the agency in coordination with FEMA and members of the task
8	force.
9	(d) Responsibilities. An urban search and rescue task force
_0	shall respond to actual or potential disasters in this
.1	Commonwealth and shall also perform search and rescue functions
_2	as delineated in The Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and
_3	Emergency Assistance Act (Public Law 93 288, 42 U.S.C. § 5121 et
4	seq.), the Federal Response Plan or its successor, Emergency
.5	Management Assistance Compact missions under Chapter 76
6	(relating to Emergency Management Assistance Compact), as
_7	requested, and the counterterrorism preparedness and response
8_	plans created in accordance with this chapter.
9	(e) Activation and deployment.
20	(1) An urban search and rescue task force or any of its
21	components, subgroups or regional elements may only be
22	activated and deployed to the scene of a disaster by either:
23	(i) the Governor or the Governor's designee; or
24	(ii) the President of the United States or a FEMA
25	<u>designated official.</u>
26	(2) During an activation and deployment by the Governor,
27	the administrative and operational costs of the task force,
28	its individual members and their employers, State agencies
29	and other parties shall be paid under the Governor's
30	declaration of disaster emergency, including paying or

1	<u>reimbursing any parties for workers' compensation and death</u>
2	benefits in the event of injury or death of an urban search
3	and rescue task force member.
4	(f) Workers' compensation and death benefits. A member of
5	an urban search and rescue task force shall be eligible to
6	receive workers' compensation and death benefits in the event of
7	injury or death that occurs during the period of activation or
8	<u>deployment.</u>
9	(g) Funding, grants and donations.
10	(1) In addition to money that is provided to a task
11	force under section 7216 (relating to grant program) or the
12	authority of section 1508 of the act of April 9, 1929
13	(P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, the urban search
14	and rescue task force may be eligible to receive grants,
15	donations of equipment and supplies and other funds from any
16	source.
17	(2) As an agent of the Commonwealth, an urban search and
18	rescue task force or regional counterterrorism task force is
19	entitled to tax-exempt status from the Federal Government.
20	(3) Beginning fiscal year 2024 2025 and each year
21	thereafter through fiscal year 2027-2028, \$6,000,000 of the
22	amount appropriated to the Department of Community and
23	Economic Development for local municipal emergency relief
24	shall be allocated to the agency as follows:
25	(i) Thirty three percent of the allocation shall be
26	distributed annually to support nonfederal missions
27	within this Commonwealth that are performed by an urban
28	search and rescue task force established within this
29	Commonwealth by the Federal Government.
30	(ii) Thirty three percent of the allocation shall be

Τ	<u>distributed annually among the urban search and rescue</u>
2	task forces established under subsection (a) (1), at the
3	discretion of the agency, based on an assessment of the
4	needs of the Commonwealth.
5	(iii) Thirty-three percent of the allocation shall
6	be distributed annually to the urban search and rescue
7	task force established under subsection (a) (2).
8	(iv) One percent of the allocation shall be retained
9	by the agency for administrative costs.
10	§ 7215. Specialized Statewide response teams.
11	(a) Establishment. The Commonwealth may establish one or
12	more specialized Statewide response teams. These specialized
13	statewide response teams shall also provide professional,
14	logistical, material and other forms of support to the regional
15	counterterrorism task forces and specialized regional
16	counterterrorism response teams organized in this Commonwealth.
17	The Commonwealth may enter into an agreement with a One Call
18	System as defined in the act of December 10, 1974 (P.L.852,
19	No.287), referred to as the Underground Utility Line Protection
20	Law, for the provision of specialized communications services.
21	(b) Organization and responsibilities Specialized
22	Statewide response teams shall be organized in accordance with
23	guidelines developed by the Commonwealth in consultation with
24	applicable Federal or State agencies.
25	(c) Activation. Specialized Statewide response teams may
26	only be activated and deployed to the scene of a disaster by the
27	Governor, the Governor's designee or an official designated by
28	the appropriate regional counterterrorism task force.
29	§ 7216. Grant program.
30	(a) Authorization. The agency may make grants to regional

- 1 <u>counterterrorism task forces, specialized regional</u>
- 2 counterterrorism response teams, specialized Statewide response
- 3 teams and urban search and rescue task forces to assist them in
- 4 <u>carrying out this chapter</u>, including entering into letters of
- 5 agreement or mutual aid agreements or providing mutual aid.
- 6 (b) Grants and funding. Regional counterterrorism task
- 7 forces, specialized regional counterterrorism response teams,
- 8 specialized Statewide response teams and urban search and rescue
- 9 task forces may receive grants and funding from the Federal
- 10 Government and the Commonwealth through application to the
- 11 agency or other entity providing grants or funding for the
- 12 <u>purposes of this chapter.</u>
- 13 <u>(c) Limitation. Grants shall only be made by the agency to </u>
- 14 the extent that funding is available.
- 15 <u>§ 7217. Miscellaneous provisions.</u>
- 16 (a) Immunity from liability. The provisions of 42 Pa.C.S. §
- 17 8331 (relating to medical good Samaritan civil immunity), 8332
- 18 (relating to emergency response provider and bystander good
- 19 Samaritan civil immunity) or 8332.4 (relating to volunteer-in-
- 20 public service negligence standard) shall apply to a member of a
- 21 specialized regional counterterrorism response team, an urban-
- 22 search and rescue task force or a specialized Statewide response
- 23 team and an individual who provides logistical, material or
- 24 other forms of emergency response support to a team or task
- 25 force during activation or deployment of a team or task force to
- 26 a potential or actual disaster or while engaged in a task force
- 27 or team drill or training exercise.
- 28 (b) Effect on workers' compensation premiums. Nothing in
- 29 <u>this chapter shall be construed to permit an insurer to raise</u>
- 30 workers' compensation premiums due to the participation or

- 1 membership of a county, municipality, volunteer service
- 2 <u>organization</u>, individual or employer on a regional
- 3 counterterrorism task force, specialized regional
- 4 <u>counterterrorism response team, specialized Statewide response</u>
- 5 <u>team or urban search and rescue task force.</u>
- 6 § 7218. Commonwealth indemnification.
- 7 The Commonwealth shall indemnify a county or municipality for
- 8 <u>costs related to damaged county or municipal property that</u>
- 9 <u>results from participation in a regional counterterrorism task</u>
- 10 force, specialized regional counterterrorism response team or
- 11 specialized Statewide response team response only when all of
- 12 <u>the following conditions are met:</u>
- 13 <u>(1) The county or municipality is responding upon</u>
- 14 <u>activation or deployment by the Governor.</u>
- 15 <u>(2) The damage to county or municipal property occurs</u>
- 16 <u>outside of the primary regional counterterrorism response</u>
- 17 zone.
- 18 (3) The county's or municipality's insurance does not
- 19 cover the property damage.
- 20 (4) The property damage was not caused by the willful
- 21 misconduct of the county or municipality or any of its
- 22 <u>employees or agents.</u>
- 23 Section 2. Title 35 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 24 § 7605. Construction.
- 25 For purposes of Article VI of the compact, "officers or
- 26 <u>employees of a party state" shall be construed to include urban</u>
- 27 search and rescue task forces as defined in section 7202
- 28 <u>(relating to definitions) that are assets of the Federal</u>
- 29 Emergency Management Agency or Pennsylvania Emergency Management
- 30 Agency and the components, subgroups and regional elements of

the task forces based in this Commonwealth. 1 Section 3.
