A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing September 11, 2014, as a day of solemn commemoration
- of the events of September 11, 2001, and offering the 2
- Commonwealth's deepest and most sincere condolences to the 3
- families, friends and loved ones of the innocent victims of
- the attacks. 5
- 6 WHEREAS, On September 11, 2001, the peace and security of our
- nation was shattered by cowardly terrorist attacks that killed
- nearly 3,000 innocent and brave people at the World Trade Center
- towers in New York City, at the United States Pentagon and in
- 10 Shanksville, Pennsylvania; and
- 11 WHEREAS, At 8:46 a.m., hijacked American Airlines Flight 11
- crashed into the North Tower of the World Trade Center in New 12
- York City, New York; and 13
- 14 WHEREAS, At 9:03 a.m., hijacked United Airlines Flight 175

- 1 crashed into the South Tower of the World Trade Center; and
- 2 WHEREAS, At 9:37 a.m., the Pentagon was hit by hijacked
- 3 American Airlines Flight 77, the impact of which caused
- 4 immediate and catastrophic damage to the headquarters of the
- 5 Department of Defense; and
- 6 WHEREAS, At approximately 10 a.m., the passengers and crew of
- 7 hijacked United Airlines Flight 93 acted heroically to retake
- 8 control of the airplane and thwart the taking of additional
- 9 American lives by crashing the airliner in Shanksville, Somerset
- 10 County, and, in doing so, gave their lives to save countless
- 11 others; and
- 12 WHEREAS, These attacks claimed nearly 3,000 innocent lives,
- 13 becoming the most devastating attack on American soil in our
- 14 history; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Many individuals unselfishly gave their lives in
- 16 unyielding courage and sacrifice with the passenger resistance
- 17 that occurred on United Airlines Flight 93 in Somerset County;
- 18 and
- 19 WHEREAS, Their acts of courage and sacrifice for our country
- 20 are worthy of acknowledgment and commendation and they shall
- 21 remain in our hearts and minds forever, their remembrance
- 22 continuing to be passed on to future generations; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Many brave people heroically, tirelessly and
- 24 courageously participated in an extraordinarily difficult and
- 25 dangerous rescue and recovery effort, in some cases voluntarily
- 26 putting their own well-being at risk; and
- 27 WHEREAS, The heroic and gallant sacrifices the emergency
- 28 medical services responders made on that disastrous September
- 29 morning are likewise worthy and deserving of commemoration,
- 30 recognition and honor on this 13th anniversary of the attacks;

- 2 WHEREAS, Thirteen years later, thousands of men and women in
- 3 the United States Armed Forces remain in harm's way defending
- 4 the United States against those who seek to threaten the United
- 5 States; and
- 6 WHEREAS, On September 11, 2001, the terrorists targeted
- 7 symbols of American strength and prosperity as an attack on the
- 8 principles, values and freedoms of the American people, but
- 9 instead, inspired the very best of American courage, compassion
- 10 and resilience and demonstrated our resolve to protect our
- 11 democracy and our way of life; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Because of the loss of innocent lives, left behind
- 13 were husbands, wives, children, mothers, fathers, brothers,
- 14 sisters, family members and friends who, along with the nation
- 15 as a whole, will forever mourn that catastrophic day and the
- 16 lives that were lost; and
- 17 WHEREAS, On the 13th anniversary of that tragic day, the
- 18 thoughts of the people of this Commonwealth and the United
- 19 States are with the victims of the events of September 11, 2001,
- 20 and their families; therefore be it
- 21 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize
- 22 September 11, 2014, as a day of solemn commemoration of the
- 23 events of September 11, 2001, and offer its deepest and most
- 24 sincere condolences to the families, friends and loved ones of
- 25 the innocent victims of the attacks; and be it further
- 26 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives reaffirm that the
- 27 people of this Commonwealth will never forget the challenges our
- 28 country endured on and since September 11, 2001, and will work
- 29 tirelessly to preserve our freedom and to defeat those who
- 30 attacked the United States; and be it further

- 1 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives pay special
- 2 tribute, on this 13th anniversary of the attacks, to all the men
- 3 and women who lost their lives on September 11, 2001.
