A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the week of October 8 through 14, 2023, as "Fire Prevention Week'" in Pennsylvania. 2
- WHEREAS, Fire is a serious public safety concern both locally 3
- 4 and nationally, and homes are the locations where people are at
- 5 greatest risk from fire; and
- WHEREAS, Home fires killed more than 2,800 people in the 6
- United States in 2021, according to the National Fire Protection
- Association® (NFPA®), and fire departments in the United States
- responded to 338,000 home fires; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Cooking is the leading cause of home fires in the
- United States, and fire departments responded to more than 11
- 12 166,400 annually between 2016 and 2020; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Two of every five home fires start in the kitchen
- with 31% of these fires resulting from unattended cooking; and 14
- 15 WHEREAS, More than one-half of reported nonfatal home cooking
- fire injuries occurred when the victims tried to fight the fire 16

- 1 themselves; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Children under five years of age face a higher risk
- 3 of nonfire burns associated with cooking than being burned in a
- 4 cooking fire; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania residents should turn pot handles
- 6 toward the back of the stove; always keep a lid nearby when
- 7 cooking; keep a three-foot kid-free zone around the stove, oven
- 8 and other things that could get hot; watch what they heat; and
- 9 set a timer to remind them that they are cooking; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Residents who have planned and practiced a home fire
- 11 escape plan are more prepared and will therefore be more likely
- 12 to survive a fire; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in
- 14 reported home fires almost in half; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania residents are responsive to public
- 16 education measures and are able to take personal steps to
- 17 increase their safety from fire, especially in their homes; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The 2023 "Fire Prevention Week'" theme, "Cooking
- 19 Safety Starts With YOU. Pay Attention To Fire Prevention'",
- 20 effectively serves to remind us to stay alert and use caution
- 21 when cooking to reduce the risk of kitchen fires; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Promoting this theme provides an ideal opportunity
- 23 to educate the public of the danger fire poses in home kitchens
- 24 throughout this Commonwealth; and
- 25 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth's first responders exhibit great
- 26 dedication to reducing the occurrence of home fires and home
- 27 fire injuries through prevention and protection education and
- 28 through their quick response to emergencies; therefore be it
- 29 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 30 week of October 8 through 14, 2023, as "Fire Prevention Week'"

- 2 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge all
- 3 residents, landlords and businesses to protect their property by
- 4 heeding the important safety messages of "Fire Prevention Week'"
- 5 which can be found on the NFPA® publicly accessible Internet

- 7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives commend all
- 8 firefighters, other first responders and all who provide support
- 9 for their efforts to prevent, fight and stop fires.
