A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of October 1 through 7, 2023, as "Climate Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Section 27 of Article I of the Constitution of
- 4 Pennsylvania declares that "the people have a right to clean
- 5 air, pure water, and to the preservation of the natural, scenic,
- 6 historic and esthetic values of the environment"; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Climate change is real and human-made, and the
- 8 impacts of climate change jeopardize both the environment and
- 9 the current and future health and well-being of the residents of
- 10 this Commonwealth; and
- 11 WHEREAS, As trustee of the public natural resources of
- 12 Pennsylvania, the Commonwealth is constitutionally mandated to
- 13 "conserve and maintain them for the benefit of all the people,"
- 14 including generations yet to come; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The consequences of inaction on the climate crisis
- 16 will be severe and potentially irreversible; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Climate policy and legislation that protect our

- 1 environment and our future generations will also create
- 2 opportunities for new jobs, safe communities and a strong,
- 3 sustainable economy; and
- 4 WHEREAS, It is the duty of elected officials to raise
- 5 awareness of the importance of environmental justice and to
- 6 protect the interests of all Pennsylvanians, especially those
- 7 who have historically been forced to bear a disproportionate
- 8 share of the adverse health, environmental and economic impacts
- 9 of pollution; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Legislative Climate Caucus stands
- 11 with national and global leaders who recognize that the time for
- 12 climate action is now; therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 14 week of October 1 through 7, 2023, as "Climate Week" in
- 15 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 17 urgent need for climate action in Pennsylvania, with the goal of
- 18 building a Commonwealth that is stronger, more resilient, more
- 19 equitable and more sustainable for present and future
- 20 generations.
