A RESOLUTION

Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to conduct a thorough review of Pennsylvania's Medicaid Home and 2 Community Based Waiver Programs in order to determine the 3 extent to which family members serve as caregivers in those programs and any barriers that exist which preclude family 5 caregiving. 6 7 WHEREAS, In Pennsylvania, the Department of Public Welfare administers nine Medical Assistance/Medicaid Waivers, including: Aging Waiver; AIDS Waiver; Attendant Care/Act 150 Waiver; 10 COMMCARE Waiver; Consolidated Waiver for Individuals with 11 Intellectual Disabilities; Independence Waiver; Infants, Toddlers, and Families Waiver; OBRA Waiver; and Person/Family 12 13 Directed Support Waiver; and 14 WHEREAS, Support Services Waivers, a short term for "Medicaid 15 Home and Community Based Waivers" provide funding for support 16 and services to help individuals to live in their homes and 17 communities and offer an array of services and benefits such as 18 choice of qualified providers, due process and health and safety

- 2 WHEREAS, The name "waiver" comes from the fact that the
- 3 Federal Government "waives" Medical Assistance/Medicaid rules
- 4 for institutional care in order for Pennsylvania to use the same
- 5 funds to provide supports and services for people closer to home
- 6 in their own communities; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Each waiver program has its own unique set of
- 8 eligibility requirements and services and each is designed to
- 9 serve a specific population of individuals with certain specific
- 10 service needs; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Studies have shown that people who have family
- 12 caregivers tend to have fewer hospital admissions, shorter
- 13 hospital stays and informal care by adult children reduces
- 14 Medicare inpatient expenditures of single older adults, as well
- 15 as expenditures for home health and skilled nursing facility
- 16 care; therefore be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the
- 18 Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to conduct a thorough
- 19 review of Pennsylvania's nine Medicaid Waiver Programs to
- 20 determine the extent to which family members currently serve as
- 21 caregivers in those programs and to identify any barriers that
- 22 exist which preclude family members of waiver service
- 23 beneficiaries from serving as paid caregivers to their loved
- 24 ones, including whether such barriers are dictated by statute,
- 25 regulation or policy; and be it further
- 26 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 27 make a report with recommendations, as appropriate, and submit
- 28 the report to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and to
- 29 members of the Aging and Older Adult Services Committee, the
- 30 Health Committee and the Human Services Committee within six

1 months of the adoption of this resolution.
