A RESOLUTION

Supporting continued and increased development and delivery of oil derived from North American oil reserves to American 2 refineries and urging the President and Congress of the 3 United States to support the continued and increased 4 production and use of American natural gas. 5 6 WHEREAS, Oil and natural gas are important components of the 7 United States' energy portfolio; and WHEREAS, A secure supply of crude oil is needed for this 8 nation's economy to thrive without potential threats and supply 10 disruptions from unstable world markets; and 11 WHEREAS, Volatile crude oil markets have added increasing 12 costs to the American economy, hampering the ability of our businesses to compete through difficult economic times and 13 14 forcing Americans to pay more and more at the pump; and 15 WHEREAS, Increased oil production in Canada's oil sands and 16 the Bakken Formation in Saskatchewan, Montana, North Dakota and 17 South Dakota can replace crude imports from countries that do not share American values; and 18 19 WHEREAS, Canada is a trusted and democratic neighbor with

- 1 rigorous environmental standards; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Our Gulf Coast refining industry processes
- 3 approximately 8.7 million barrels per day, or half of the
- 4 refining capacity in the United States; and
- 5 WHEREAS, In 2011, these refineries of the Gulf Coast imported
- 6 approximately 5 million barrels per day of crude oil from more
- 7 than 30 countries; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Once completed, the proposed TransCanada Keystone XL
- 9 and Gulf Coast Expansion projects could displace roughly 40% of
- 10 the oil our nation currently imports from the Persian Gulf and
- 11 Venezuela; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Pipelines are the safest method by which to
- 13 transport petroleum products when compared to other methods of
- 14 transportation; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The Keystone XL pipeline will replace the equivalent
- 16 of 200 ocean tankers per year and thereby reduce greenhouse gas
- 17 emissions by as much as 19 million tons, or the equivalent of
- 18 taking almost 4 million cars off the road; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The Keystone XL pipeline project has been subject to
- 20 the most thorough public review process of any proposed pipeline
- 21 in the United States and has also been the focus of multiple
- 22 environmental impact statements and several United States
- 23 Department of State studies; and
- 24 WHEREAS, These analyses have concluded that the Keystone XL
- 25 pipeline project poses the least impact to the environment and
- 26 is much safer than other modes of transporting crude oil; and
- 27 WHEREAS, New natural gas production in shale formations
- 28 across the nation offer the United States additional
- 29 opportunities for energy independence; and
- 30 WHEREAS, The President of the United States has recognized

- 1 the importance of clean, domestic natural gas to our economy and
- 2 energy independence and has pledged to eliminate inefficiencies
- 3 in permitting natural gas operations; therefore be it
- 4 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 5 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania support continued and increased
- 6 development and delivery of oil derived from North American oil
- 7 reserves to American refineries; and be it further
- 8 RESOLVED, That the President and Congress of the United
- 9 States be urged to support the continued and increased
- 10 production and use of American oil derived from the Bakken
- 11 Formation in Saskatchewan, Montana, North Dakota and South
- 12 Dakota, as well as Canadian oil sands; and be it further
- 13 RESOLVED, That the United States Secretary of State be urged
- 14 to approve the newly routed pipeline application from
- 15 TransCanada to increase our energy independence, create new
- 16 jobs, build our economy, reduce fuel costs, improve our national
- 17 security and strengthen ties with our northern neighbor and
- 18 ally; and be it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That the President and Congress of the United
- 20 States be urged to support the continued and increased
- 21 production and use of American natural gas; and be it further
- 22 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 23 the presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each
- 24 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
