A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the Department of Environmental Protection, as a result
- of the findings of the Legislative Budget and Finance
- Committee's report, Proposed Revisions to Biosolids General
- 4 Permits PAG-07, PAG-08, and PAG-09, not to implement the
- 5 proposed revisions.
- 6 WHEREAS, In 2021, the Department of Environmental Protection
- 7 released proposed revisions to the General Permit for the
- 8 Beneficial Use of Exceptional Quality Biosolids by Land
- 9 Application (PAG-07), General Permit for the Beneficial Use of
- 10 Biosolids by Land Application (PAG-08) and General Permit for
- 11 the Beneficial Use of Residential Septage by Land Application
- 12 (PAG-09); and
- WHEREAS, Last session, the General Assembly adopted House
- 14 Resolution 149, Printer's No. 2542, which directs the
- 15 Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to study the impact of
- 16 the Department of Environmental Protection's proposed revisions;
- 17 and
- 18 WHEREAS, The resulting report shares significant concerns
- 19 related to implementation of the Department of Environmental

- 1 Protection's proposed revisions and the increased cost to
- 2 ratepayers, municipalities and the agricultural industry; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Legislative Budget and Finance Committee also
- 4 uncovered the following unintended consequences with the
- 5 Department of Environmental Protection's proposed revisions:
- 6 (1) Issues with landfilling biosolids.
- 7 (2) Issues with incineration of biosolids.
- 8 (3) The availability of land application sites;
- 9 and
- 10 WHEREAS, The Department of Environmental Protection has not
- 11 estimated the significant cost of permit holder compliance and
- 12 the need for new municipal infrastructure to comply with the
- 13 proposed revisions; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The Department of Environmental Protection has not
- 15 addressed how waste management facilities, communities and the
- 16 agricultural industry would, in practice, comply with the
- 17 proposed revisions; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The Department of Environmental Protection has not
- 19 demonstrated any potential environmental benefits as a result of
- 20 the proposed revisions; therefore be it
- 21 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge the
- 22 Department of Environmental Protection, as a result of the
- 23 findings of the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee's
- 24 report, Proposed Revisions to Biosolids General Permits PAG-07,
- 25 PAG-08, and PAG-09, not to implement the proposed revisions; and
- 26 be it further
- 27 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to
- 28 the Governor and the Secretary of Environmental Protection.
