A RESOLUTION

- Designating April 28, 2023 2024, as "Knoebels Amusement Resort <-Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, In 1828, Reverend Hartman Henry Knoebel purchased a
- 4 plot of land in central Pennsylvania, then known as "Peggy's
- 5 Farm"; and
- 6 WHEREAS, This land was eventually passed down to his grandson
- 7 of the same name, who developed a lumbering and sawmill
- 8 business; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Roaring Creek runs through the center of the land
- 10 and drew the attention of local townsfolk looking for a place to
- 11 relax and cool off on hot summer days; and
- 12 WHEREAS, They enjoyed creek side picnics and jumping off the
- 13 covered bridge into the swimming hole below; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The swimming hole sparked an idea from Henry
- 15 Knoebel, and, in November 1925, he began construction on a large
- 16 pool in the same location where the Crystal Pool resides today;

- WHEREAS, On July 4, 1926, Knoebels Amusement Resort
- 3 officially opened; and
- 4 WHEREAS, In the same year, Henry Knoebel also opened a
- 5 restaurant on the grounds and featured a steam-powered carousel
- 6 operated by Philadelphia businessman, Joe Gallagher; and
- 7 WHEREAS, In 1938, Knoebels Amusement Resort purchased the
- 8 carousel from the Gallagher family, but as Knoebels Amusement
- 9 Resort continued to grow, a larger carousel was needed; and
- 10 WHEREAS, George Kremer originally built Knoebels Amusement
- 11 Resort's Grand Carousel in 1913, and renowned craftsman, Charles
- 12 Carmel, carved the horses; and
- 13 WHEREAS, It was purchased from Riverview Park in Rahway, New
- 14 Jersey, in 1941; and
- 15 WHEREAS, With this acquisition came the addition of two
- 16 organs, and Knoebels Amusement Resort remains one of only a
- 17 handful of places where guests can still catch a brass ring and
- 18 earn a free ride on the carousel; and
- 19 WHEREAS, In 1960, Pete Knoebel purchased the Pioneer Train to
- 20 honor his late father; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Pete Knoebel purchased the small train to take
- 22 riders through the woodlands surrounding Knoebels Amusement
- 23 Resort from Allen Herschell Company's Miniature Train Division;
- 24 and
- 25 WHEREAS, The Pioneer Train's track stretches a pleasant one
- 26 and a half miles through the backwoods of the park, where riders
- 27 can observe many types of wildlife; and
- 28 WHEREAS, The forested beauty of Knoebels Amusement Resort
- 29 drew many families to the area and they built cottages along the
- 30 banks of Roaring Creek, some of which remain today; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Many others camped on Knoebels Amusement Resort's
- 2 grounds; and
- 3 WHEREAS, In 1963, Knoebels Amusement Resort introduced its
- 4 first six official campsites; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Since that time the campground has grown to more
- 6 than 550 sites and 57 log cabins; and
- 7 WHEREAS, In 1996, Knoebels Amusement Resort also acquired
- 8 nearby Lake Glory Campground; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Knoebels Amusement Resort has endured several
- 10 natural disasters, beginning with the devastating floods of
- 11 Hurricane Agnes in 1972; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Floodwaters reached 24 of the park's 25 rides, but
- 13 the park was operational only nine days later; and
- 14 WHEREAS, To celebrate the park's return, the Haunted Mansion
- 15 was designed and built by park staff and opened in 1973; and
- 16 WHEREAS, After celebrating Knoebels Amusement Resort's 50th
- 17 anniversary in 1976, the park introduced its first roller
- 18 coaster in 1977, the Jet Star; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The coaster was the first of its kind in this
- 20 Commonwealth, with a top speed of 40 miles per hour, and the
- 21 coaster thrilled riders through the 1992 season; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Knoebels Amusement Resort continued to grow and
- 23 expand, and, in 1980, it was the largest park without a major
- 24 wooden roller coaster, a distinction that ownership wanted to
- 25 change; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Originally built in 1947 for a park in San Antonio,
- 27 Texas, the Phoenix was, at the time, the largest roller coaster
- 28 to ever be moved from one park to another; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Despite much doubt that this venture would be
- 30 successful, the Phoenix opened in Knoebels Amusement Resort on

- 1 June 12, 1985, and to this day consistently places in the top 10
- 2 wooden coasters; and
- 3 WHEREAS, In the summer of 1990, Knoebels Amusement Resort
- 4 introduced its first water ride, the Giant Flume; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Honoring the natural beauty of the valley, the flume
- 6 was built to preserve as many trees as possible, providing
- 7 riders a quick way to cool off with a bit of shade and a
- 8 pleasant splash; and
- 9 WHEREAS, On September 7, 2011, Knoebels Amusement Resort
- 10 experienced another flood, which is marked as the worst in
- 11 Knoebels Amusement Resort's history; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Roaring Creek and Mugser Run rose several feet above
- 13 flood level, with damage far exceeding the flood of 1972; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Yet with the help of staff and the community, the
- 15 park was able to reopen a mere 10 days later; and
- 16 WHEREAS, In 2007, Knoebels Amusement Resort became an even
- 17 more complete resort with the addition of Jepko's Three Ponds
- 18 Golf Course; and
- 19 WHEREAS, This course was opened and had been operated by the
- 20 Jepko family since 1959; and
- 21 WHEREAS, This acquisition by the fourth-generation members of
- 22 the Knoebel family became official on January 16, 2007, and the
- 23 course was renamed Knoebels Three Ponds; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Knoebels Amusement Resort announced in 2013 that it
- 25 was adding the park's tallest ride; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Towering at 148 feet, the StratosFear stands well
- 27 above the park's former tallest feature, the Giant Wheel; and
- WHEREAS, The 45-acre amusement resort has 64 rides, 28 games,
- 29 24 gift shops, 14 attractions, 2 arcades, 34 food and beverage
- 30 locations with full-service catering available, the 900,000-

- 1 gallon Crystal Pool and park mascots: Kozmo (a chipmunk), Dexter
- 2 (a raccoon), Piper (a red fox) and Kreeper (a Halloween
- 3 character); and
- 4 WHEREAS, Knoebels Amusement Resort is America's largest free-
- 5 admission amusement park and offers free parking, free
- 6 entertainment and free picnic facilities; therefore be it
- 7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate April
