A RESOLUTION

Commemorating the 300th anniversary of the establishment of 1 Upper Merion Township. 2 3 WHEREAS, In the early 18th century, Swedish and Welsh immigrants settled along the banks of the Schuylkill River in 4 5 southeastern Pennsylvania in the area known today as Upper 6 Merion Township; and 7 WHEREAS, The township's establishment dates back to 1713, 8 when the King of Prussia Inn and several other inns in the 9 region were required to pay six shillings to the legislature for 10 licenses to operate their businesses; and 11 WHEREAS, In its early years, the township maintained a rural 12 character, consisting primarily of farms and large estates such 13 as the Manor of Mount Joy, which William Penn presented to his 14 daughter, Letitia; and 15 WHEREAS, As Upper Merion Township grew, it became home to

small villages such as King of Prussia, Swedeland and 1 2 Swedesburg, whose names reflected the cultural origin of many of 3 their inhabitants; and

4 WHEREAS, In addition, Upper Merion Township also became known for industrial activities such as a large lime manufacturing 5 business located in the village of Port Kennedy; and 6 7 WHEREAS, IN 1893, Upper Merion Township received national 8 acclaim with the establishment of Valley Forge State Park "as a 9 shrine to commemorate the encampment of the Continental Army 10 there during the winter of 1777-78"; and

11 WHEREAS, The 20th century continued to bring prosperity to the township as various transportation routes intersected in the 12 13 region and it was soon obvious that Upper Merion Township was 14 destined to become a major center of economic activity in 15 southeastern Pennsylvania; and

16 WHEREAS, This trend continued into the 1960s as the M.A. Kravitz Company constructed the King of Prussia Plaza, which was 17 18 considered "the world's largest shopping center" at the time; 19 and

20 WHEREAS, Upper Merion Township has become one of the Philadelphia region's premier office and retail communities and 21 22 employs more people than any other municipality in Montgomery 23 County; and

24 WHEREAS, This year marks the 300th anniversary of the 25 establishment of Upper Merion Township; and

26 WHEREAS, It is fitting to commemorate this important milestone due to the contributions Upper Merion Township has 27 28 made to the history of this nation and our Commonwealth; 29 therefore be it

30 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives commemorate the 20130HR0069PN0535
