AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for definitions and
- 3 for duty of commission.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Sections 8901 and 8904(1) and (2) of Title 51 of
- 7 the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:
- 8 § 8901. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 10 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Annual income." All income received by an applicant and the
- 13 applicant's spouse while residing in the residence during the
- 14 calendar year prior to the year for which the exemption is
- 15 claimed.
- 16 "Blind." Visual acuity of three-sixtieths or ten two-

- 1 hundredths, or less normal vision.
- 2 "Commission." The State Veterans' Commission established
- 3 under section 1702 (relating to State Veterans' Commission).
- 4 "Income." As follows:
- 5 (1) All income from whatever source derived, including
- 6 any of the following:
- 7 (i) Salaries, wages, bonuses, commissions, income
- from self-employment, alimony, support money, cash public
- 9 <u>assistance and relief.</u>
- 10 (ii) The gross amount of any pensions or annuities,
- including 50% of railroad retirement benefits.
- 12 <u>(iii) Fifty percent of all benefits received under</u>
- the Social Security Act (49 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. § 301 et
- 14 <u>seq.), except Medicare benefits.</u>
- 15 (iv) All benefits received under State unemployment
- insurance laws and veterans' disability payments.
- 17 (v) All interest received from the Federal or a
- 18 state government or an instrumentality or political
- 19 <u>subdivision of the Federal or a state government.</u>
- 20 (vi) Realized capital gains and rentals.
- 21 (vii) Workers' compensation.
- (viii) The gross amount of loss of time insurance
- benefits, life insurance benefits and proceeds, except
- for the first \$5,000 of the total of death benefit
- payments.
- 26 (ix) Gifts of cash or property, other than transfers
- by gift between members of a household, in excess of a
- total value of \$300.
- 29 <u>(2) The term does not include surplus food or other</u>
- relief in kind supplied by a governmental agency, property

- 1 <u>tax or rent rebate or inflation dividend.</u>
- 2 "Paraplegic." The bilateral paralysis of the upper or lower
- 3 extremities of the body.
- 4 § 8904. Duty of commission.
- 5 The commission shall:
- 6 (1) Fix uniform and equitable standards for determining
- 7 the need for exemption from the payment of real estate taxes
- 8 granted by this act. In fixing such uniform and equitable
- 9 standards, [the commission shall apply a rebuttable
- presumption that] an applicant with annual income of \$75,000
- or less [has a need for] shall be deemed to be in need of the
- exemption. Beginning on January 1, 2009, and every two years
- thereafter, the commission shall [adjust] <u>increase</u> the annual
- income level qualifying for the [rebuttable presumption of
- need] exemption for need by an amount equal to the [change]
- 16 <u>average of any increase</u> in the Consumer Price Index in the
- 17 preceding two years. The commission shall publish the
- adjusted annual income level qualifying for the [rebuttable]
- 19 presumption of] <u>exemption for</u> need as a notice in the
- 20 Pennsylvania Bulletin.
- 21 (2) [After] For applicants with an annual income that
- 22 exceeds \$75,000, after submission of proof of need by the
- 23 applicant for the exemption from payment of real estate
- taxes, determine the need of the applicant.

- 26 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
